






City Spotlight: Community Initiative in Grambling





Cane River National Heritage Area Launches Next Phase of Discovery Center Project with New Website and Fundraising Campaign

NATCHITOCHES, LA – Cane River National Heritage Area (CRNHA) is proud to announce the next stage in the development of the Cane River Discovery Center, a dynamic new children's museum and visitor center designed to inspire curiosity, exploration, and a deep connection to the region's rich cultural and natural heritage.

Following the successful completion of the initial planning and concept development phase, CRNHA is now launching its fundraising campaign to bring the Discovery Center to life. As part of this effort, CRNHA has unveiled a new website, www.caneriverdiscovery.org, where visitors can explore the center's vision, view early design concepts, and learn how to support the project.

Located within the Natchitoches Outdoor Recreation Corridor, the Cane River Discovery Center will serve as both an interactive learning space for children and a gateway for visitors to explore the heritage, landscape, and outdoor offerings of the Cane River region. The facility is thoughtfully designed to serve residents, school groups, and tourists alike, with a focus on hands-on exhibits and interpretive storytelling.

The Discovery Center's planning phase was made possible through support from the National Park Service. The project team includes Propel Consulting, leading project management and interpretive planning; Tipton Associates, a Baton Rouge-based architecture and design firm; Ashe Broussard Weinzettle Architects, a Louisiana architecture firm with experience across public and institutional projects; Carbo Landscape Architecture, specializing in immersive and context-sensitive outdoor spaces; and Taylor Studios, a nationally recognized firm for exhibit design and fabrication. Together, this team developed a phased master plan that will guide the Discovery Center's development, beginning with exhibit design and fundraising and continuing through construction, which is tentatively scheduled to begin in 2027.

The new center will feature the adaptive reuse of CRNHA's existing headquarters at 4115 University Parkway. Originally a bank building, the property was purchased in 2021 and will be transformed into a vibrant space for interpretation, education, and visitor services. Adaptive reuse is core to CRNHA's mission and reflects a long tradition on Cane River of reusing and repurposing what we have to build a stronger, more sustainable region.

"We see the Cane River Discovery Center as a meaningful addition to the region, one that supports both heritage tourism and hands-on learning," said Rebecca Blankenbaker, Executive Director of CRNHA. "This project has been thoughtfully developed over several years, and with the planning phase complete, we're ready to move into implementation alongside our partners and community. The Discovery Center will honor the region's cultural legacy while encouraging stewardship of the landscapes and waterways that define Cane River country. It's about helping the next generation understand how our land has shaped our story, and how we care for it going forward."

To kick off the fundraising campaign, CRNHA is excited to announce the Cane River Mini Golf Tournament, a family-friendly event hosted in partnership with Dark Woods Adventure Park. The event highlights CRNHA's commitment to collaborating with local partners and advancing the broader vision of the Natchitoches Outdoor Recreation Corridor, a growing initiative aimed at enhancing outdoor tourism and community wellness in the region.

The tournament will feature themed holes, local prizes, and special opportunities to learn more about the Discovery Center project. All proceeds will directly support the development of the facility and its exhibits.



Terrell wins Festival Red Beans & Rice cookoff

NATCHITOCHES – With his entry "Ashli's Beans," Dane Terrell of Natchitoches won first place in the Judges' Choice Category in the 2025 Red Beans & Rice Cookoff held at Northwestern State University as part of the 45th Annual Natchitoches-NSU Folk Festival. 3 Stooges, comprised of Jacob Carpenter of Belmont, Daniel Warren of Robeline, and C.J. Vercher of Provencal, took second place, and third place winners were Laurie and Merrill Smith of Ball.

Ashli's Beans took first place in the Protein Sausage Category, with 3 Stooges winning first place in the Other Protein Sausage Category. 3 Stooges also took the People's Choice Award.

Kristie Brown, Felicia Lawson, and Shirley Winslow managed the Cookoff. Judges were Donna Baker, University Archivist and Records Officer of the Cammie G. Henry Research Center at NSU; Eli Dyjack, NSU undergraduate; and Dr. Kent Peacock, assistant professor of history and director of the Creole Heritage Center at NSU.

"This year's festival theme was Crafting Louisiana, and so it was fitting how each of the entries made for the cookoff highlighted the level of skilled craftsmanship and art there is in making great cuisine," said Dr. Shane Rasmussen, director of the Festival, "All of the entrants made amazing food, and we thank them for sharing with us their culinary talents."

When the Festival returns next July, it will host a Gumbo Cookoff. Updates will be posted on the Louisiana Folklife Center website in Spring 2026.

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE CITY OF NATCHITOCHES ANNOUNCES SAFE STREETS FOR ALL DEMONSTRATION GRANT PROJECT

Natchitoches Mayor Ronnie Williams, Jr., announces that a grant agreement has been executed with the Federal Highway Administration for the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Demonstration project that was awarded to the City in 2024.

This grant provides \$870,000 in Federal funding for the design and construction of temporary countermeasures to improve safety for road users. Including the City's required 20% match, a total of \$1,087,500 will be available for the installation of temporary safety features along Keyser Avenue, as well as construction of temporary speed tables on the following City streets: Dixie Street, East Fifth Street, Fairgrounds Road, Hill Avenue, Parkway Drive, Sanford Street, and South Williams Avenue.

These locations and safety improvements were identified as part of the SS4A Action Plan which was completed early last year, for which the City previously received \$270,000 in Federal grant funding.

The planned approach of installing temporary safety measures will provide for a post-construction evaluation period for monitoring of the operation of these temporary measures and their effectiveness at reducing crashes. This approach will allow future adjustments to be made at these locations if necessary, which would not be possible with more permanent types of construction.

Now that the grant agreement has been fully executed, the next step toward implementation of this project is procurement of a consultant engineering firm for preparation of plans and specifications for the project. Construction is anticipated to begin in mid-2026.

The City of Natchitoches also recently submitted an application for additional SS4A grant funding for implementation of the remaining High Priority safety improvements identified in the SS4A Action Plan, and is awaiting selection by the U.S. Department of Transportation for the 2025 grant awards.

Belief in Angels in Islam: The Unseen World of Light and Obedience

One of the foundational pillars of Islamic faith is the belief in the unseen (ghayb), a principle underscored at the very beginning of the Qur'an. In **Surat al-Baqarah**, Allah praises those who are conscious of Him and describes the righteous as those who "believe in the unseen, establish prayer, and spend out of what We have provided them" (Qur'an 2:3). Among the unseen elements central to Islamic belief are the angels, or al-malā'ikah—creatures created from pure light who serve as Allah's messengers and agents across the cosmos.

The Nature and Creation of Angels

According to Islamic teachings, angels were created from **light** (*nūr*). The Prophet Muhammad **said**:

"The angels were created from light, the jinn were created from smokeless fire, and Adam was created from what has been described to you."

(Şaḥīḥ Muslim, 2996)

Unlike humans or jinn, angels do not eat, drink, sleep, or reproduce. They do not possess free will as humans do; rather, they are in a constant state of obedience to Allah. Allah describes them as:

"...they do not disobey Allah in what He commands them but do what they are commanded."

(Qur'an 66:6)

Their Form and Abilities

The Qur'an tells us that angels may have **multiple wings**, far beyond the typical human imagination.

"[All] praise is [due] to Allah, Creator of the heavens and the earth, [who] made the angels messengers having wings, two or three or four. He increases in creation what He wills..."

(Qur'an 35:1)

They are immense in size and can traverse vast realms with divine permission. Angel **Jibrīl (Gabriel)** was described as having **600 wings**(Ṣaḥīḥ al-Bukhārī, 4954), and his form could fill the entire horizon when revealed to the Prophet **3.**

However, angels can also take **human form** when sent to convey messages. This was seen when Angel Jibrīl visited Maryam (Mary), the mother of Isa (Jesus), and appeared as a man:

"...then We sent to her Our Spirit, and he a in appeared to her as a well-proportioned man."

(Qur'an 19:17)

Likewise, in the famous ḥadīth of Jibrīl, the angel came in the form of a man to teach the Companions about the fundamentals of Islam (Ṣaḥīḥ Muslim, 8).

Functions and Roles of Angels

The Qur'an and Sunnah describe numerous roles for the angels:

- **Delivering Revelation:** Jibrīl is the archangel responsible for conveying revelation to the prophets.
- "Say, [O Muhammad], 'Whoever is an enemy to Jibrīl—it is [none but] he who has brought it [the Qur'an] down upon your heart by permission of Allah...'" (Qur'an 2:97)
- **Recording Deeds:** Every person is accompanied by two angels who record every word and action.
- "When the two receivers receive [him], seated on the right and on the left. He utters no word except that with him is an observer prepared [to record]." (Qur'an 50:17–18)
- **Guardian Angels:** There are also angels assigned to protect human beings by Allah's command.
- "For each one are successive [angels] before and behind him who protect him by the decree of Allah..."

(Qur'an 13:11)

- **Taking Souls:** The angel **'Izrā'īl** (Malak al-Mawt) is responsible for removing souls at death.
- "Say, 'The Angel of Death who has been entrusted with you will take you. Then to your Lord you will be returned."

Belief in Angels in Islam: The Unseen World of Light and Obedience

- Control of Elements: Certain angels are appointed over wind, rain, and nature. These include Mīkā'īl (Michael), who is believed to oversee rain and provision.
- Afterlife Duties: Angels are the gatekeepers of Paradise and Hell, such as Mālik, the keeper of Hell (Qur'an 43:77), and others who welcome believers into Paradise (Qur'an 39:73).

Misconceptions: Was Satan an Angel?

A common misunderstanding, often influenced by **Biblical interpretations**, is that **Shayṭān** (**Satan**) was an angel who fell from grace. However, the Qur'an makes it clear:

"He was from the jinn, so he rebelled against the command of his Lord..." (Qur'an 18:50)

Although Iblīs was in the company of angels and commanded alongside them to prostrate to Adam, he was **created from fire** and therefore **not an angel**.

"You created me from fire and him from clay." (Qur'an 7:12)

This distinction is important: angels are created from **light**, jinn from **smokeless fire**, and humans from **clay**—each with different roles and moral capacities.

Conclusion

Belief in angels is not a mystical side doctrine in Islam; it is a **core tenet of faith**. From guarding human beings to delivering divine revelation, the angels are ever-present and ever-obedient creations of Allah. They are reminders of the unseen order that governs existence, and believing in them is essential to understanding the vastness of Allah's creation.

In future articles, we will further explore their interactions with the prophets, their presence in the afterlife, and how understanding angels can deepen one's spirituality.


