

The 2025 Induction Celebration kicked off Thursday, June 26, with the free Welcome Reception from 5-7 p.m. at the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame and Northwest Louisiana History Museum at 800 Front Street in downtown Natchitoches.

The fun-filled Friday, June 27, slate begins with the midday Celebrity Bowling Bash at Four Seasons Bowling Center in nearby Alexandria. Friday evening's big party is the Rockin' River Fest free concert on the Cane River Lake downtown stage, accompanied by the VIP Taste of Tailgating party, a ticketed event at the adjacent Mama's Oyster House on Front Street above the concert venue.







#### Juneteenth Flag, Colors, and Meaning

The Juneteenth flag, created in 1997 by activist Ben Haith and refined in 2000 by illustrator Lisa Jeanne Graf, symbolizes African American history and identity. Its red, white, and blue colors reflect the American flag, asserting that enslaved African Americans and their descendants are integral to the nation's history. The red symbolizes the blood shed on the journey to freedom.

#### Key elements include:


\*\*Star\*\*: The white star represents Texas, where Juneteenth originated, and the freedom of African Americans across all states.

\*\*Burst (Nova)\*\*: The starburst signifies a new beginning and the liberation represented by Juneteenth.

\*\*Arc\*\*: The curved line symbolizes hope and progress for future generations of Black Americans.

\*\*Date (June 19, 1865) \*\*: Added in 2007, this marks the day the Emancipation Proclamation was enforced in Texas. The design mirrors the American flag to highlight that African American history is part of American history, celebrating the end of slavery and the vision of equality. Red also represents the sacrifices made by enslaved ancestors.







#### **Outside of the Official Juneteenth Flag Colors and Meaning**

Outside of the official Juneteenth flag, you may see many people with red, black, and green (and sometimes yellow) clothes and flags. These are adapted from the Pan-African flag and are used to symbolize Black freedom and unification, with each color providing unique symbolism.

- Red: Blood shed by Africans who died in the fight for liberation and the shared blood of the African people
- Black: The Black skin of the African peoples
- Green: Growth, prosperity, and the fertility of Africa

Yellow: While not part of the Pan-African flag, many African countries added this color

to represent mineral wealth





## WHAT IS JUNETEENTH?



In 1863, President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation, which stated that all persons held as slaves in rebellious states shall be set free.

Two years later in 1865, the enslaved people of Galveston, Texas finally learned that they had been set free from slavery.

Juneteenth is an important celebration of black liberation.

#### The Krewe of Excellence Recognizes JAG Students





The size of the completed sketch or painting should be 18 inches wide and 24 inches tall. If chosen, the painting will become the exclusive property of the Natchitoches Arts Council. The chosen artist will receive a commission of \$600.

The deadline for entering the competition is Friday, August 1, 2025. All entries should be submitted to The Office of Community Development, 420 Fourth Street, Natchitoches, LA 71457. The Natchitoches Arts Council is not responsible for insuring the safe or timely delivery of the artwork to the appropriate party. We do reserve the right to refuse any submissions and to extend the deadline.

Numbered prints in the form of a poster will be available and on sale to the public in October. All posters are \$35 each. The 1980-2004 collage posters are \$15 each. The small posters ( $3\frac{3}{4}$ " x 5") are \$3 each or two for \$4. Special prints of the 2008 Fleur de Lis Poster (11" x 17"), the 2016 Christmas in Natchitoches Poster (11" x 14.5") and the 2019 Sacred Crossroads (11" x 14" reprint of the 1986 poster) are \$20.

The Natchitoches Christmas Festival Poster has been a tradition for 45 years. All of the original artwork can be viewed at the Natchitoches Arts Council office located at the Community Development Office, 420 Fourth Street or City Hall, 806 Second Street, Natchitoches, LA.

#### 45th Annual Natchitoches- NSU Folk Festival

NATCHITOCHES – The 45th Annual Natchitoches-NSU Folk Festival will be held on Saturday July 19, 2025, in air-conditioned Prather Coliseum located at 220 South Jefferson Street at Northwestern State University in Natchitoches. The festival's curated showcase of Louisiana folk musicians, food vendors, and traditional crafts persons will open at 9 am, with live entertainment scheduled for 9:30 AM to 9:30 PM. The family-oriented festival is fully wheelchair accessible. Children 12 and under are admitted free. Tickets are \$10 at the door for all events, or \$6 for an evening pass to all events after 5 PM.

The festival features three stages of music. Music headliners include Cajun band Amis du Teche, zydeco band Chubby Carrier and the Bayou Swamp Band, blues artist D.K. Harrell, western swing artist the Kristyn Harris Band, roots band Smithfield Fair, gospel group the Amazing! Rhythm Disciples, and swamp pop dance band the Has Beans. The festival also includes numerous food vendors offering traditional Louisiana cuisine. Outdoor activities feature demonstrations of traditional blacksmithing, Dutch oven cooking, and a child-friendly hands-on demonstration of a 19th century wash day.

In honor of this year's theme, Crafting Louisiana, more than 80 crafts vendors have been invited to display and discuss their traditional work with festival patrons. Craftspeople are expected to display beadwork, baskets, cowhide chair covers, alligator jewelry, Pysanky eggs, Native American crafts, and pottery. Other expected craftspeople will display needlework, wood carvings, handmade toys and dolls, paintings, sculpture, homemade soap, spinning & weaving, handcrafted knives, handmade brooms, walking sticks, folk art quilts, and more. The Festival will include a Red Beans & Rice Cookoff, in which professionals and hobbyists alike can compete in one of multiple categories and demonstrate their cooking skills. Registration and the Cooks' Meeting will take place at 8:00 AM. Tasting and judging will begin at 12:30 PM, with winners be announced at 3:30 PM. There is no fee to compete in the Cookoff. Red beans & rice must be cooked on-site outside of Prather Coliseum, but beans may be pre-soaked.

The Annual Louisiana State Fiddle Championship will be held at 1 PM in the Magale Recital Hall. There will be a non-championship class and a championship class. 

#### **Basic Private Investigator Training Course to be held in July**

Participants will also learn to conduct undercover investigations, employ surveillance techniques, perform interviews, and take statements.


