





"Attorney Dan Dyess's Nottoway Plantation: Natchitoches Preservationist's Vision Lost to Fire"

Nottoway Plantation, located in White Castle, Louisiana, was the largest antebellum mansion in the South until it was destroyed by fire on May 15, 2025. Built in 1859, this 53,000-square-foot mansion features Greek Revival and Italianate architecture, symbolizing both architectural grandeur and the horrific history of chattel slavery. Attorney Dan Dyess, a preservationist from Natchitoches, acquired Nottoway in late 2024 from the estate of Jaeger. Dyess, who also owns the Steel Magnolia House Bed and Breakfast, aimed to preserve the mansion's history while enhancing it as a venue for events and tourism. His plans included making structural repairs, reopening the restaurant, and hosting cultural events. However, on May 15, 2025, a fire—believed to have been caused by an electrical issue—started in the south wing and ultimately destroyed the main house. Dyess expressed his devastation but intends to evaluate rebuilding in the coming weeks, recognizing the site's economic importance to Iberville Parish and its complex historical legacy.

In a statement, Dyess said, "I take this position — we are non-racist people. I am a lawyer, and my wife is a judge. We believe in equal opportunity rights for everyone, total equality, and fairness. My wife and I had nothing to do with slavery, but we acknowledge its wrongness. We are trying to make this a better place. We have no interest in left-wing radical ideas. We need to move forward positively and won't dwell on past racial injustice."
















Youth Volunteer Summer Service Grant 2025

Funding for the Youth Volunteer Summer Service Program gives our youngest community members more opportunities to become engaged in their communities and make volunteerism a lifelong habit.

It is with great pleasure to announce that Morning Star Baptist Church is a recipient of the Youth Volunteer Summer Service Grant for 2025. Youth Volunteer Corps (YVC) is a network of affiliated organizations across the U.S. and Canada running the same program by engaging youth ages 11-18 in team-based, structured, diverse, and flexible service-learning opportunities. This program is offered to students in 7th- 12th grades to engage in volunteer opportunities. The four fundamental goals of YVC are to:

- 1. Engage teams of youth in volunteer service projects that are challenging, rewarding, and educational.
- 2. Serve the needs of the community.
- 3. Promote a greater understanding and appreciation for diversity in their community.
- 4. Inspire youth to a lifetime ethic of service.

During YVC meetings, students discuss and identify needs that are unique to their individual communities and plan service projects to address those needs. The YVC allows students a fun and convenient way to accrue service hours to receive the Community Service Diploma Endorsement offered by the Louisiana Department of Education.

YVC affiliates are hosted by credible nonprofit organizations or are independent YVC programs. Each YVC program looks a little different depending on the host organization and the local community, but they all implement the same program model and receive ongoing support and resources from YVC Headquarters.

This project is funded by a Youth Volunteer Summer Service Grant from The Rapides Foundation, and Morning Star Baptist Church has been awarded \$5,000 over four months beginning May 1, 2025, and ending August 31, 2025.


Outpatient Medical Center's Mental Health Fair

Natchitoches, LA: Justin Roberson, a 5'11" shooting guard from Natchitoches, has gained international recognition as a key player for BC Samara in Russia's VTB United League. His journey embodies grit and talent, starting on local courts and progressing to a successful college career at the University of Louisiana at Monroe (ULM), where he earned accolades, including the 2015-16 Sun Belt Conference Defensive Student-Athlete of the Year. After college, Roberson played in Switzerland, Russia, and the USA, notably tying his career-high of 29 points with Fribourg Olympic and achieving standout defensive performances with Parma. "Playing overseas is tough, but Natchitoches taught me to stay grounded," he said. Back home, he's an inspiration for local youth, showcasing that dreams can come true. His recent season with BC Samara further solidified his reputation, as he averages double-digit points while leading in defensive plays. "Every time I step on the court, I'm carrying Natchitoches with me," Roberson states, making him a symbol of perseverance for his community. 





Who Killed K'yia Pier?


A Mother Seeks the Public's Help (names omitted for legal reasons)





The chosen artist will receive a commission of \$600.

The deadline for entering the competition is Friday, August 1, 2025. All entries should be submitted to The Office of Community Development, 420 Fourth Street, Natchitoches, LA 71457. The Natchitoches Arts Council is not responsible for insuring the safe or timely delivery of the artwork to the appropriate party. We do reserve the right to refuse any submissions and to extend the deadline. Numbered prints in the form of a poster will be available and on sale to the public in October. All posters are \$35 each. The 1980-2004 collage posters are \$15 each. The small posters (3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 5") are \$3 each or two for \$4. Special prints of the 2008 Fleur de Lis Poster (11" x 17"), the 2016 Christmas in Natchitoches Poster (11" x 14.5"), and the 2019 Sacred Crossroads (11" x 14" reprint of the 1986 poster) are \$20. The Natchitoches Christmas Festival Poster has been a tradition for 45 years. Characteristics of True Leaders Versus a Bigot



Martin Luther King Jr.

- Transformational Leadership: King's ability to inspire and motivate people, articulate a clear vision for the future, and create a sense of shared purpose are key aspects of transformational leadership. He was able to connect with people on a deep level and encourage them to believe in the possibility of change.
- **Servant Leadership:** King's focus on serving others and prioritizing their well-being is a hallmark of servant leadership. He was known for his humility, empathy, and willingness to put the needs of others before his own.
- Entrepreneurial Leadership: King's ability to build alliances, cultivate partnerships, and connect with people from diverse backgrounds reflects the principles of entrepreneurial leadership. He understood the importance of working with others to achieve a common goal.
- Nonviolent Leadership: King's unwavering commitment to nonviolence was a
 defining feature of his leadership style. He drew inspiration from Mahatma Gandhi's
 philosophy of nonviolent resistance and applied it to the fight for civil rights.



Malcolm X

- **Disciplined and Principled:** Malcolm X lived with strict personal discipline, rooted in his NOI training and later his Sunni Muslim faith. He adhered to moral codes, avoiding alcohol and drugs, and emphasized self-reliance and community upliftment.
- **Empathetic Leader:** He connected deeply with marginalized Black communities, drawing from his own experiences with poverty, incarceration, and racism. His authenticity resonated, making him a voice for the alienated.
- Systemic racism and white supremacy, often at great personal risk.

 As a minister for the Nation of Islam (NOI), he boldly criticized

 American hypocrisy, earning both admiration and enmity. 29

Malcolm X

- Reflective and Self-Critical: He openly acknowledged past mistakes, such as his criminal youth or initial NOI dogmatism. His willingness to evolve publicly, even under scrutiny, reflected rare humility and introspection.
- Inspirational and Visionary: His emphasis on Black pride, self-determination, and global solidarity inspired generations. His autobiography, co-authored with Alex Haley, remains a timeless testament to personal transformation and resistance

Slang definition of bigot: a person who won't listen to anyone whose ideas or beliefs are different from his or her own. especially: one who regards or treats the members of a group (as a racial group) with hatred and intolerance.



- **Mocking of Leadership:** They openly mock Black leaders—politicians, activists, or cultural icons—accusing them of corruption, ineffectiveness, or exploiting the community for personal gain.
- Provocative and Confrontational: They use inflammatory language to shock or gain attention, often framing their critiques as "tough love" or "speaking truth." This can include derogatory terms or stereotypes about Black culture, delivered through platforms like social media.
- Performative Authenticity: They emphasize their "realness" or insider perspective, using their age, background, or street credibility to legitimize their critiques. They might claim to speak for the "silent majority" of Black people frustrated with their community's direction.
- Selective Focus: Their criticism often ignores positive contributions or resilience within the Black community, focusing instead on negative stereotypes or sensationalized issues. They may downplay systemic racism, attributing problems solely to individual or cultural failures.
- Older and Pessimistic: As an older figure, they may draw on personal experiences of hardship or disillusionment (e.g., growing up in tough environments or witnessing failed reforms) to justify their bitterness. This pessimism fuels a belief that the community is inherently flawed or resistant to change.
