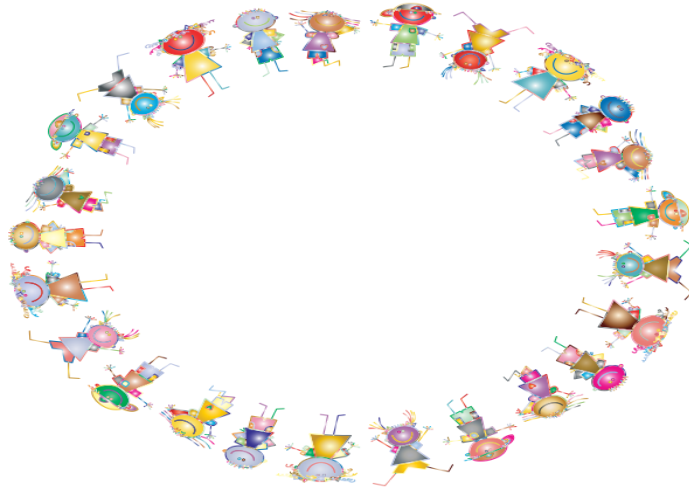

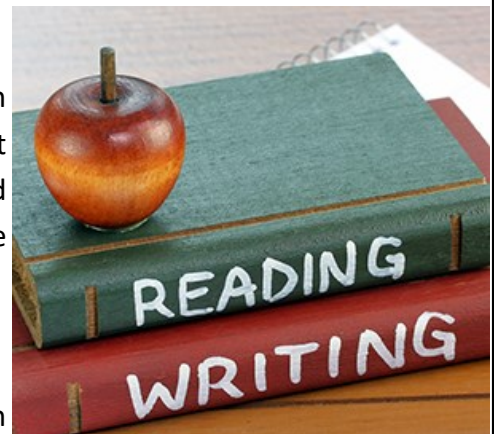

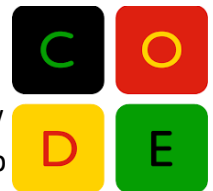

Bible School | Convocation

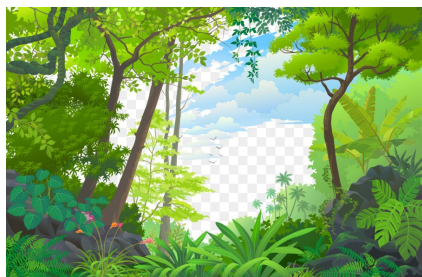
A 4-part series for Vacation Bible School engages children's imagination!

A CRITIQUE OF AMERICAN HISTORY

THE HERITAGE AND LEGACY OF BLACK AMERICANS

Black History Instruction | Teacher Outline

- 1) USA-University Colleges, Institutes, K12 Schools serving students in one or more of the grades K through 12 shall provide instruction on Black history as part of all educational programming.
- 2) The instruction required under paragraph (a)(1) of this section is provided through curricula developed.
- 3) At a minimum, Black History instruction must include all of the following:
 - a. The history and culture of Black people prior to the African and Black Diaspora, including contributions to science, art, and literature.
 - b. The significance of enslavement in the development of the American economy.
 - c. The relationship between white supremacy, racism, and American slavery.
 - d. The central role racism played in the Civil War.
 - e. How the tragedy of enslavement was perpetuated through segregation and federal, state, and local laws.
 - f. The contributions of Black people to American life, history, literature, economy, politics, and culture.
 - g. The socio-economic struggle Black people endured, and continue to endure, in working to achieve fair treatment in the United States; including the agency employed in this work for equal treatment.
 - h. Black figures in national history and in USA—University Colleges History***
- 4) The curricula developed must rely heavily on primary sourcing to receive a true perspective of the Black experience inclusive of the triumphs, setbacks, and contributions of Black persons.



ALL SCHOLARS

The study of Black History serves to educate students about how Black persons were treated throughout history in this country. The study of Black History is intended to do all of the following:

- 1) Examine the ramifications of prejudice, racism, and intolerance.
- 2) Prepare students to be responsible citizens in a pluralistic democracy.
- 3) Reaffirm the commitment of free people to the Thirteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution.

Instruction required under this section must be designed to do all of the following:

- 1) Be trauma-responsive and recognize the impact of racial and historical trauma on students.
- 2) Stimulate students' reflection on the roles and responsibilities of citizens in democratic societies to combat racism, inequality, and discrimination through tools of resistance such as protect, reform, and celebration.
- 3) Incorporate contemporary events into discussions of Black History and the tools of resistance.
- 4) Develop students' respect for cultural and racial diversity.
- 5) Enable students to understand the ramifications of prejudice, racism, and stereotyping.
- 6) Provide opportunities for students to discuss and uplift the Black experience.
- 7) Provide students with a foundation for examining the history of discrimination in the State.
- 8) Explore the various mechanisms of transitional and restorative justice that help humanity move forward.
- 9) The Department of Education shall develop and make publicly available a list of resources to assist USA– universities, colleges, institutes, K-12 schools in creating Black History curricula. The department shall consult with organizations that provide education about the experiences of Black people, or seek to promote racial empowerment and social justice, including the following:
 - a. NAACP: The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People
 - b. The Health of the American Culture
