

THE CHURCH GETS A NEW ROOF



On behalf of our Church and co-chair Eric Nitsch, I am pleased to announce that we have raised \$15,365 to date toward the expense of replacing the roof and gutters of our historic Church meetinghouse. To the eight donors among us, a heartfelt "thank you" for your generosity and commitment to the future of our church building and congregation. The quoted price of the project is \$55,500 of which this fund





drive will defray over 25%. That saves Memorial Gift funds which are a very important part of our "rainy day" financial strategy.

We will "keep the window" open for any additional contributions and update you later in the spring. No contribution is too small and all are greatly appreciated.

ALL CHURCH MEETING MINUTES

April 21, 2024

The meeting was called to order by Moderator Terry Putnam at 12:15 pm followed by an opening prayer by Rev. Paul. A motion was made to approve the March All-Church Meeting Minutes as published in the Gold Dome. With no questions or discussion, it was approved unanimously.

Pastor's Report

Rev. Paul expressed a special thank you to everyone for last week's 250th service and celebration. Bible study will resume on May 2nd and 9th at 2:30 pm in Westfield and 7 pm in Southwick. He will be away the week of May 13th to attend the Festival of Homiletics in Pittsburgh. We will have a visiting minister Sunday May 19th.

Treasurer

Jim Putnam was not able to have an updated financial report but stated financially everything is good and we are operating close to budget. He is in the process of converting from an older version of Quickbooks to an updated version. He offered thankyou's to contributors to our roof fund and thank you letters are in process. Contributions to the roof fund will still be gladly accepted.

Finances

Melanie Nitsch said the group met on April 18th.

They discussed and agreed to increase the rental price of our halls for outside groups. The Building Use Agreement will be updated. The estimate for replacing the roof is \$55,500 with \$15,365 donated so far, leaving approximately \$40,000 to be paid by Memorial Gifts. Donations are still being accepted and the final cost may be increased if there are overages on the project.

The new copier for the church office will be in place in mid-June. We will have a new lease in place with H.L. Dempsey. Dempsey has agreed to remove the old copier and bring it to the return depot. We have discussed and agreed to change our operating bank accounts from Berkshire Bank over to Westfield Bank. This will be done at the Treasurer's convenience. We feel their services will be of better use to the church. Memorial Gifts also holds their accounts with Westfield Bank.

Karen Brzezinski and Jim Putnam will be meeting with an investment manager from Westfield Bank regarding investment options for the church's Memorial Gifts stock portfolio.

Building & Grounds

Eric Nitsch reported he and Bob Franzen hung the church's 250th

banner on the front pillars of the church. He thanked Terry & Jim Putnam for designing and purchasing it.

A new door knob was replaced on Rev. Paul's office.

The roof project will start Monday, 4/22/24, and hopefully be done in 3-4 days.

The committee will be getting quotes to remove the overgrown shrubbery around the parsonage.

They received a quote to cover the concrete wall outside of the Old Fellowship Hall door from a masonry company using stone veneer at a cost of \$5,500. It would make the wall look very nice but the group will search out other options and other quotes from area companies.

Rev. Paul asked to have a dedication service scheduled for the new tree planted.

Christian Ed

Kirsten Allhusen reported she is planning on handing out Bibles to the children of the church on the first Sunday in June.

Deacons

Patty Banasik reported the group is looking for Deacon fill-ins for over the summer when the regular Deacons are away. She will be sending a thank you card to the First Congregational Church of Westfield for all their help with our 250th celebration dinner.

Music

Jen Cotto reported Music Sunday will be June 9th. They are looking for suggestions for summer music and anyone is asked to contact herself or Roberta Kowal.

Pastoral Relations

Bob Franzen reported things are going well with no issues reported.

New Business

The annual Historical Society Dinner will be held at our church on 4/25/24. This is a fundraiser for our church and Patty Banasik is the organizer and looking for helpers for that day. The Society follows their dinner in Old Fellowship Hall with their annual meeting in New Fellowship Hall.

Jim Putnam asked about the status of finding storage space for the Girl Scouts. Eric Nitsch will follow-up on asking the Boy Scouts to find room for them in their closet space. They will also be asked to evaluate what is stored in the attic and clean out anything unnecessary and organize the rest.

Jim also requested that the Boy Scouts use one bulletin board in

NFH (rather than 2), and clean it up from very old postings. The other board can then be offered to the Girl Scouts. Eric Nitsch will also follow-up on this with the Boy Scout leaders.

It was noted there are five bulletin boards in Old Fellowship Hall that are not used, some unreachable, and some need to be cleaned of old postings. A suggestion was made to have a friendly competition for the best bulletin board design between the Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, and Cub Scouts with a prize (a \$35 gift card to Moolicious) offered to the winner.

Terry Putnam offered to work with Joseph to communicate with the Girl Scouts and Cub Scouts regarding the bulletin boards. A motion was made to make the bulletin board changes with the Scouts and storage space changes which was seconded and passed

unanimously.

A discussion took place about informing Joseph when our halls and kitchen will be needed for set-up for special events and dinners and asking him to communicate well ahead of time with the outside groups that use these spaces certain evenings of the week that they may need to move their meetings upstairs or reschedule.
