



ALL CHURCH MEETING MINUTES

November 10, 2024

The meeting was called to order by Moderator Terry Putnam at 12:20 pm. following refreshments and opened with a prayer by Rev. Paul. A motion was made to approve the Minutes from the October Executive Committee Meeting which was seconded and with no discussion were passed unanimously.

Pastor: Rev. Paul Nesbit offered a big thank you to all who volunteered to work the turkey dinner held Nov. 9th – servers, kitchen workers, cooks, musicians, all ages. Upcoming events include:

vice along with a children's Christmas pageant
Dec. 24th – Christmas Eve service in Westfield at 4:30 pm and in Southwick at 6:30 pm.

Dec. 29th – Both churches worship together at Southwick Cong. at 11 am

Treasurer: Jim Putnam reported as of 9/30/24 we are running at a deficit of about \$20,000, true to budget expectations. Upcoming fundraisers should help lower this along with the rent received from the Southwick Community Episcopal Church.

Buildings & Grounds: Eric Nitsch reported the Manger will be set up Dec. 1st in the afternoon. Our steeple bell has not been ringing as the striker system is in need of repair. The wood base is cracked. Eric is working on getting quotes for a new system or investigating repairing the current system. Also, a work order has been made with a request for a door for the kitchen to be installed on the right side entry to be able to close off the kitchen completely when necessary, especially when prepping for dinners.

Christian Ed: Kirsten Allhusen presented Bibles today during the worship service to our four youth. This presentation had been delayed from last June. Kirsten would like to host a screening of the movie "Nativity", possibly Dec. 21st in the late afternoon, and invite the youth and the community.

Finance: Melanie Nitsch reported Jim P completed the annual worker's comp audit and had some serious issues with the treasurer's laptop which he got fixed. Rev. Paul composed our annual stewardship letter (thank you!) to be sent out the week of November 10th as Stewardship Sunday is Nov 17th. Melanie is working on a rate quote comparison for our prop-

erty insurance. Melanie, Patty, Bob, and Terry have begun contract renewal negotiations with Rev. Paul and the representative group from First Church of Westfield. Rev. Paul's three year contract is up as of Feb. 1st, 2025. A copy of the insurance policy from Southwick Community Episcopal Church has been requested for our files and Melanie is investigating the need to have them added to our current policy.

Music: Jen Cotto reported through email there was no new business.

Pastoral Relations: Bob Franzen reported the group met with Rev. Paul on Oct. 23rd and had a discussion about time management and trying not to be over-committed. Moderator: Moderate Terry Putnam asked for a motion to continue, as previously voted on, with a total compensation package cap for Rev. Paul of \$50,000. A special meeting will be called if that cap needs to be exceeded. This was discussed, seconded, and passed unanimously. Also, a signed lease is still needed from Southwick Episcopal Community Church along with a copy of their liability policy.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:50 pm. Respectfully submitted, *Melanie Nitsch, Clerk*
