Jesus said to his followers, "Get to work!" He taught them about the kingdom of God. He gave them work to do: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." He proved to them and to us that he is alive.

Get to work, he says, and remember that your work is not done in vain. Your work has meaning and purpose because I am alive! Your work of transition is an opportunity to see your faith journey in a new light, perhaps new directions and with new energy.

Secretary's Report: As printed in the March Church Newsletter.

Total mileage: 342. Thank you for all who have stepped up to help with so many things such as Lenten suppers & services, confirmation mentors, special music, and live stream the Shelstad funeral. Youth Rep. Report: Softball, baseball, track seasons are underway. KW band and choirs recently performed at solo ensemble contest with many superior awards and Elsie Braaten received best on sight. There will be a music garden concert on May 1 and HS spring concert on May 8. The KW speech team is a state alternate. The KW middle school play was performed 4/19 & 4/20. Planning is underway for another Community Theater this summer- everyone is welcome! April 24th is the national honor society induction/graduation, Prom is May 4, May 15 is Baccalaureate, and Graduation is June 2.
