

Secretary's Report: Reviewed as printed in the July Church Newsletter.

The first part of my parental leave will begin October 5, if not earlier. I will return in time to be present for Confirmation Sunday (October 26). President's Report: I wanted to start off by sending my gratitude for everyone's efforts so far this year, we have gotten so much done and have made some good work (ex: the organ fundraising/coming together to make that all happen was just amazing). This good work has not gone unnoticed- Huge thank you! I am unavailable for Council on Wednesday the 20th due to completing my last School Board Training session (3 hr zoom session- yuck!). From last council until now I have served communion several times and set up once. I dropped off and picked up a very excited Hunter for VBS- He loved it again this year. Brought Hunter and a friend to the pool party which was also fun, and I was happy to see the weather held out for us. I am still investigating the options to replace Servant Keeper (due to age). I have a request into Pastor Marggi for Pastor Care for Pastor DJ's Parental Leave- Stay tuned for that.

Ongoing Items:

- 1. <u>Organ Repair</u>: Obermeyer has picked up the counsel and expect to begin placing the organ back into place the next week or two. Cleaning and painting was done to the organ chamber while it was out.
- 2. Potential Trip to Colombia: No update
- **3.** <u>Constitution Review</u>: No updates. Worship committee will have agenda items at their meeting on Monday night.
- **4.** <u>Farmer's Market Shed Request</u>: A motion was made to approve the agreement as presented between the City of Kenyon and FLC. It was requested that an attempt be made to color match our current shed, if the option exists. Tammy/Brad/pass
- 5. Phone & Internet Service: Due to an increase of \$110/ month to our phone and internet bill Tammy explored alternate options. Metronet is able to offer a 3 year contract, business fiberoptic internet service with Wi-Fi and 2 phone lines (primary phone and elevator) for \$165.60 per month. Motion was made to change our internet and phone service to Metronet. Carmen/Amy/Pass. Tammy will complete the steps to complete the contract, then installation will most likely take place in September.

Youth Rep. Report: Many youth participated in the Goodhue County Fair this month. Fall sports have now begun, with first games, meets and scrimmages already happening this week. There is a state fishing tournament at the end of the month and recently a TOC fishing tournament that Seth and Ross Aldorfer participated in.

<u>Property and Management</u>- The committee did meet on August 20th. The following items were discussed or took place over the past month: As scheduled, 2 new mini splits were installed in the church sanctuary by Reliable and are now operational. Not yet scheduled but a new boiler will be installed prior to the heating season also by Reliable. A pickle ball court was painted onto the concrete surface in the SE corner of the church parking lot. Additional organ components have been removed and some taken to organ repair company for needed work. We anticipate the rebuild to begin in the next couple of weeks. The organ chamber was cleaned and foiled walls painted to reduce potential glare. Temporary re-direct of rainwater coming off church roofs has been a success (in terms of ed wing basement staying dry). Committee is considering the option of burying those lines with pop-ups as a more permanent solution.

Stewardship- Thank you to those who donated items to the June Stewardship Challenge: 1 Month/100 pounds. We received a good assortment of items needed for the All-Seasons Food Shelf. We donated 126.8 pounds to the Food Shelf. Committee did not meet in July. Our focus for the rest of the summer will be General Benevolence. Also promote the Love offering for the SWO Convention in Waseca on September 27. Youth and Education- The outdoor movie for Rose fest was a grand community success, over 125 people in attendance. There is a sign up in the fellowship hall for volunteers for the rally Sunday breakfast. Will plan to hold another Garage Sale next March and some items have already been donated and are being stored in the education wing.
