Consent Agenda Items:

Secretary's Report: Reviewed as printed in the November Church Newsletter.

Treasurer's Report: November giving was good, but we are not anticipating a December as good as past years, based on some of the larger one-time gifts from past years already given in November, or given many members who are no longer with us. We received a generous gift towards benevolence from one giving unit which allowed us to satisfy our pledge. Last year we needed to transfer funds out of our budget reserve to meet the pledge. November attendance was down an average of 10 people per Sunday.

Pastor's Report: It is the third week of Advent, and I am Joyful that we share in ministry together here at First Lutheran Church. Thank you to council and committee members for your leadership through another year and thank you to the congregation for being attentive and curious, and for showing up to figure out life together as disciples of Christ. Here are my updates since the last Council meeting: Home visits are ongoing. People appreciate staying connected through online worship, church communications, cards, phone calls, and visits. Kenyon Community Connections: Kenyon area Thanksgiving service was on Tuesday, November 25 at 6 pm at Dale: lots of good pie to go around! Community Meal happened on December 3: thank you to the Worship Committee and volunteers for your leadership and coordination. Will discuss what future opportunities like this could look like. Thanks to all involved with Beau Chant on December 13. I missed this concert due to a fundraiser concert, I was playing bass in, that day in Owatonna. Confirmation/High School: Wednesday Night Confirmation is ongoing. Students have helped and participated in Advent meals and services this month. I'm making lesson plans for when I am on leave next month and will coordinate with families on that. Thanks to all who helped with Simmer Pot packing and Sunday School Christmas shopping. Attended the High School Band and Choir Christmas Concert. Thank you to the high schoolers involved: you brought Joy this season through your musical gifts and talents! Synod/Churchwide events: Attended Conference meeting on December 11 in Faribault—we had an Advent hymn sing service and did a team-building activity of gingerbread house making. Experienced mounted TVs in worship service, too, and connected with Pr. Joe re: process. Sat in on webinar re: MN paid leave and I'm in the process of getting approved for that. Thanks to Julie D., Tammy, and Erica for your time and support on this. Met with the new pastor at Grace (Nerstrand) and began conversation about potential areas of collaboration. Other: LeRoy Ashland's Celebration of Life was on November 26. Grief Support group met on Monday, December 1 at 2 pm: everyone is welcome, no matter the type of grief you carry. Next meeting: Monday, February 23 at 2 pm. Men's Ministry Bible is ongoing, previewing the lectionary. Plan to begin Bible study open to the congregation during Lent. Advent Wednesday Night services are/were at 6:30 pm/following congregational meals Theme: The Season of waiting. I will use about seven more weeks of parental leave as follows: December 28-January 20 (Back for Annual Meeting); January 26-February 17. Caring Fund money: checks ready to go and plan to split between Kenyon Market and gas station gift cards. Weber/St. John piano/violin concert scheduled for Thursday, September 10 at 7 pm. November 20-December 17 Mileage (\$37.80) + other expenses (\$68.18) Total: \$105.98.

President's Report: Continue to assist with communion set-up and serving; assisted with the community meal; have pastoral supply covered during Pastor D.J.'s leave; we will have 2 lay-led services during that time. Working on filling the ballot for 2026 positions, we have many needs, and I am not having a lot of luck.

Approve Consent Agenda: Motion to approve the consent agenda: Tammy/Carmen/pass

Ongoing Items:

1. **Sanctuary Screen & Projector Research:** The intent of the screens would not be to incorporate into worship or interface on-line, but to use as a supplement to begin with. The thought would be having one TV, 96" possibly, on each side of the church. One family unit recently donated \$2200 to the technology fund. Motion to approve \$5,000 to purchase 2 TVs for the sanctuary in January. Tammy/Eric/Pass.

New Items:

1. Kenyon Area Foundation Grant: Kenyon area foundation was awarded a grant from the McKnight Foundation and in turn gifted \$2500 to First Lutheran Caring Fund to be used locally to help families in need. The grant check will be mailed out to us sometime before the end of the year and will be reflected in FLC financial statements beginning January 2026. Other Kenyon recipients of this fund were the Kenyon police department and the Kenyon Area Food Shelf.
2. 2026 Budget: The council made a motion to present the budget as presented in the annual report for vote at the annual meeting. Eric/Amy/pass
3. Pastor D.J. added to bank accounts: Motion was made to add Pastor D.J. Chatelaine to both the First Lutheran Church Credit Card and the First Lutheran Youth Account at Security State Bank, Kenyon. Eric/Chris/Pass

Youth Rep. Report: Winter sports continue. Boys and girls basketball both had a very close loss to Randolph this week and also have a double header in Triton on Friday. Wrestling had a recent tournament and several KW wrestlers placed. November 30th Luke Cordes became the latest Kenyon Eagle Scout. Congrats, Luke! The high school band and choir concert was held on Friday 12/12. Go online and re-watch it. The band messed up on the 2nd song, see if you can see catch it! Christmas break begins 12/24.

Committee Reports:

FLCW- FLCW meeting was held December 14 with 9 ladies present, discussed: Gifts for staff set and approved. Homebound cards are being sent out. The mitten tree is in the back of the church, **waterproof mittens and gloves are in great need**. Reviewed the 2026 FLCW booklet draft. Will be sending it out by email to save on paper. More information to come. Year-end distribution of funds discussed. \$2,800.00 is being dispersed. The full report will be in the annual report. Next meeting January 11, 2026. A flyer with information and registration forms are available in the fellowship hall for the 2026 Women of the ELCA Triennial Convention in Des Moines, Iowa on 7/16-7/19 2026. Upcoming Love Day Dates: 1/8; 1/22 - looking for new helpers!

Worship/Evangelism- Short meeting while preparing for Community meal. Looking for meals for Advent Wednesday service but will wait determine need once Community meal is done (leftovers). Christmas Eve service is planned. Looking for volunteers for 12/28 lay-led Sunday. Community meal free will donations of \$343 were donated to the food shelf.

Property and Management- Thank you to the members who provide snow removal to FLC! Discussion on the front stairs and snow: continue to rope off but add a sign that welcomes and directs guests to the side doors.

Stewardship- Thank you for all benevolence giving that helped us to meet our pledge.

Youth and Education- Christmas Simmer kits were a hit again; we made plenty of extras and still have some on hand to sell. We are now selling them 2 for \$10. Our annual youth Christmas shopping day was so much fun; the kids were able to get some pretty fantastic gifts for their family members. Thank you to all the volunteers that came to help out! Upcoming events: Live Nativity & Noisy Offering Sunday Dec. 21st As we head into the New year, EdYou would greatly appreciate THRIVENT dollars again. KAIC- Met on 12/16. There were only 3 churches represented. Grace Lutheran is likely out, which means we are down to 6 congregations. Feedback from the survey (only FLC and Trinity in West Concord had results) was positive, showing that we want to continue to work together in some form. Requests for an intern have been sent to 3 additional seminaries, but it remains unlikely we will get an intern. KAIC has a challenging reputation due to the coverage of multiple sites.

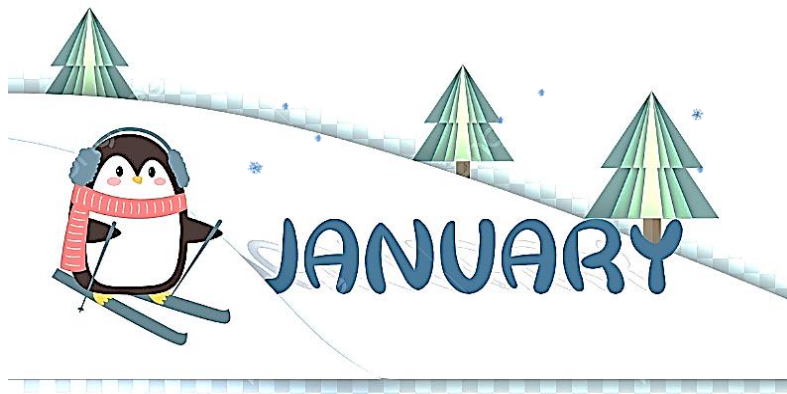
