Consent Agenda Items:

Secretary's Report: Reviewed as printed in the July Church Newsletter.

Treasurer's Report: Giving and attendance have been significantly down in July and so far in August, the lowest seen in years. Net income so far for 2024 (January through July) is \$-4595. The laptop and software used for First Lutheran's financials are outdate and need to be replaced. Tammy will present a proposal at a future meeting in hopes of beginning 2025 with new.

Pastor's Report: 2 Sundays; 2 Wednesday worship. 19 visitations including counseling/bereavement, premarital counseling, pastoral care, and office visits. 4 children's messages and attended National Youth Gathering. 6 meetings including council, Kenyon area internship committee, staff secretary, Lutheran Campus Center Board. Total mileage: 202. The month of July we celebrated the Sundays after Pentecost with Jesus going from this village to that village. We had Tom Ersland playing his guitar helping lead worship again. We blessed Luke Cordes as he went to the National Youth Gathering. We have had Wednesday worship and Cookout, with people coming. We continue the live broadcast for the services and are grateful to our tech team who makes this happen each week, we continue to average 50 views each week. I attended Kenyon Area Internship Committee luncheon meeting to talk about a pastoral question of the month with Brittany. I attended the National Youth Gathering as part of the Logistics Team. Also, the KAIC regular meeting to hear the news of another intern has been assigned. A request for \$500 for professional development for time spent at the national youth gathering was discussed. Ongoing Items:

- 1. <u>Website</u>: Survey recommendations were shared with Margaret and edits/corrects were made. No further changes until a new pastor is employed and can be involved in the planning decisions for the future of the website.
- 2. <u>Outreach and Activity Ideas</u>: Stewardship committee continues to host a food drive and will begin seeking donations for Ruth's House; Rose fest activities such as movie night and quite display were enjoyed by many.
- 3. <u>Call Committee</u>: Looking forward to voting on 8/25. Reminder that only official voting members may vote. Carmen Nesseth will be chief teller, Sherry Sathrum will also perform as teller. Tellers will have a list of all current voting members.
- 4. <u>Potential Organ Repairs</u>: Council reviewed and discussed repair proposals. Agreed to move forward with a congregational vote (required due to the cost of the repair). Voting to be announced and occur later this fall.

New Items:

- **1.** New Pastor Meet & Greet: Waiting until after the vote on Sunday 8/25 and input from potential new Pastor to plan further.
- **2.** Rumor Mill: Council members are encouraged to joyfully celebrate all the changes and happenings at First Lutheran and help dissuade rumors.

Youth Rep. Report: not present, no report.

Committee Reports:

<u>FLCW</u>- Thank you to the many volunteers for successfully helping sell hot dogs, chips and beverages at the stand on Saturday August 17th. The Love Day Ladies organized and hosted a quilt display during Rose Fest also on August 17th. 49 quilts, 8 baby quilts, and 10 Afghans were displayed. 81 quilts were brought in by many wonderful, talented women. A 3–4-gallon plastic dispenser for lemonade was donated to FLCW. Will give support as needed for Rally Sunday on September 8th. Upcoming Love Days at 1pm: 8/22, 9/12, 9/16, 10/10, 10/24.

<u>Worship/Evangelism</u>- The worship committee did not formally meet in August. Our outreach for August was free children's crafts at Aug 15 Farmer's market. We would like to know how we can help support Rally Sunday events.

<u>Property and Management</u>- A 2nd proposal for upgrading the church organ has now been received from Obermeyer Organ Company of Burnsville. It too proposes to pull out and essentially rebuild the organ over a period of 3 months. Representatives from both companies are quite amazed that the 70-year organ is still in relative working order but feel the rebuild is long overdue. The thunderstorm on July 13 may have been the reason both cameras used to record Sunday services recently failed. Both have been repaired by the manufacturer and are now back in place and in proper working order. Thank you goes out to Steve Johnson for coordinating and working with Fette Electronics to make this happen. Suppressors have also been installed in order to reduce the chance of similar damage in the future. Was brought to our attention that Route 60, the company that installed and performed maintenance on our boilers and mini-splits is no longer in business. The committee is considering options to replace the service provider for any future necessary work in the church.

<u>Stewardship</u>- Food Shelf donations continue through August. Still working on membership update forms. Stewardship Challenge and Pancake Feed following worship on Rally Sunday, Sept. 8. Sunday, September 15 is Community Rally Day Worship with local ELCA Churches at Holden Park. Seeking supply donations for Ruth's House in Faribault. Lists of items will be posted on line, and around church prior to September 15. There have been inquiries about the missionaries we support.

Youth and Education- Luke and Elsie attend the National Youth Gathering and had a great time. They will share with the congregation and Sunday school class about the event. A pool party was held and had a great turn out and fun had by all. The outdoor movie event was held inside due to weather but had GREAT turn out. Popcorn, cotton candy, pop/water were the most profitable items. Planning for Rally Sunday on September 8th, Sunday school, and children's singing during worship every 4th Sunday of the Month. Seeking Sunday school teachers and fundraising ideas.

<u>KAIC-</u> Our new Intern, Yvonne, will start in Sept. She and her husband are moving here from CA and have found a place in Northfield. Chris Cordes has been in contact with this year's intern mentor, Pastor Chad Christenson in West Concord. There has been discussion about the intern's role in each church. The church council discussed where we could use the intern services, and will let Pr. Chad know. This could be visitation, Bible study, confirmation, funerals. Council would like entertain a meeting with the KAIC representatives in the future. The use of our church office was discussed, Pastor Chad has asked for space in Kenyon due its central location. The KAIC Pastors and Intern would like to meet at First Lutheran on a monthly basis.

<u>Long Range Planning/Personnel/Endowment/Committees</u>- no reports. The personnel committee met to review an offer package for the potential Pastoral call.
