

Your Faerie Queen Muse ~ Spiritual Benefactor

One of eight chose YOU. So, unless you have undergone the guided visualization in the lesson video, STOP reading. We don't choose.

The Faerie Queen Muse, the Spiritual Benefactor who chooses you is an Ancient One. The Ancient Ones that we call to depend chiefly upon our individual tuning AND knowledge and experience within the Faery-Faith Tradition. The Ancient Ones do exist, they are esoteric archetypes to which we can attune ourselves by surrendering to the mystery of communion with them. This allows our own special creative flow to enliven us, as well as help us achieve a more perfect sense of balance in our mundane and spiritual living.

The Ancient One who comes can help us learn more about our personalities by using their ancient tales to demonstrate what influence their energy will have in our lives—but, only should we call upon them after our first meeting. I have chosen eight Irish goddesses, all of whom I am very familiar with and feel confident that your adventure with any of them will be beneficial rather than challenging. YES, some can become very confrontational and challenge us constantly. I do not wish to overwhelm you.

Within the grouping of eight, I will say ALL are equal. One is not better than another. Yet, each are unique and maintain a different vibration.

Please note at this time I have only indicated the meaning for currently active students in the course. Over time, this list will become complete.

Maeve is an ancient goddess with an ancient battle to fight, namely the one against Cuchulainn. They represent the battle of the sexes. Though she is vilified in folk tales, Maeve is a true representation of the Divine Feminine disrespected, disparaged and forced into submission. Her myth is a lengthy one that has multiple parts to it. Her husband was High King Aillelle, and as high queen she was the ruler of truth. Her title and position mythologized as a brown bull was stolen from her and this began a war. She was connected to sexual freedom and noted to be a wild woman. When her moontime was upon her, even in the midst of battle, a temporary halt with be called and she and her maidens in the throes of the red tide would float in gentle pools near a waterfall until the blood emptied from their womb. Thus, she was a Moon Goddess as well as connected to the water element, though her primary element is Air. The bull is an ancient icon for the Moon Goddess, whose horns were the crown she wore symbolizing that she was of a triple nature (the horns representing the new and waning crescent, and the crown the full moon). If Maeve is your Spiritual Benefactor, she brings to you a teaching surround the awareness of the magick of the Faery World, which can often tempt one into pursuing matters of insignificance when done so through the mind only. Rather, she shows the importance of seeking to find spiritual enlightenment by simply walking your talk.

Cailleach Bera has the qualities of builder, doer, and renewal. She also contains the qualities of gentleness and peace; they can be found as we understand the environment in which she dwells, usually that of lonely places away from the villagers and clans. Her symbols are water, deer, cattle, swine, goats, and the wolf. She rules the water, the emotions, the intuition and feelings and illustrates the duality of water: stagnant or flowing, through her ability to dam up a stream when she drops the rocks from her apron to build a mountain in much the same way one might resolve hurtful weeping to find inner strength, or to dismantle the dam to allow the water to flow in much the same way one might allow themselves to feel the emotion that is moving within. Deer are symbols of gentleness, the tender relationship that would exist between a mother and child. Cattle are connected with the more earthy aspects of this goddess in her fertility aspects, as well as in the nurturing ability to feed offspring and others with her milk. Swine represents both life and death; the fertility aspect of the fast-growing, rounded body, as well as the dark aspect of nature that does not tolerate weakness or incompetence just as the sow will eat any of her young that are flawed. Pig was also considered the feast of the gods and was served at the ritual table. The goat is the symbol of warmth, for the skin was valued for clothing. Finally, the wolf is the symbol of the pathfinder, the teach, the Crone. If Cailleach Bera is your Spiritual Benefactor, then the time has come for you to find the gentleness of your Spirit. The time has come for you to nurture yourself by applying gentleness, warmth, and caring. Within you, this new energy will build for it is your mountain. Frequent this mountain often, for in the aloneness of your power place you will find your true self. Look within for your spiritual teacher.
