


# **CFAPOA Member Survey**



# Q1 How long have you owned property on the Chip?





# Q2 On which side of the Big Chip do you own property?











Q6 Which of the following invasive species are you aware of that are present on the Chippewa Flowage?





# Q7 How concerned are you about invasive species on the Chip?


























Q19 Other than using it to pay your annual dues, how often to you visit the CFAPOA website?








**Q20** How interested are you in volunteering for committees or special projects of the CFAPOA.






Q23 Would you be interested in serving on the CFAPOA Board in the future?
