Measuring Success

88% Kids sustained their literacy levels 78% of kids said they enjoyed the healthy snacks 95% of participants felt the staff was a caring person

- Each member won individual prizes!










A Conversation with Michelle Obama - October 2019

Over **98%** of students sustained or improved their literacy levels throughout the summer


17 preschoolers were ready for school in September

22 youth and adults played leadership roles


2020 Plans


- To stay connected; via phone calls, door knocks, outdoor activities
