


PARIS. A guided tour of unforgettable Paris

4 nights

If it's your first or fiftieth time in Paris there's always too much to see. 3 nights

Lyon is ground zero for foodies so Les Halles de Lyon Paul Bocuse is high on our list! To walk off the calories, do a walking tour of the old city centre of Lyon, or maybe just take a food tour! MARSEILLE. Much more than the world's best bouillabaisse!

1/2 day

Stop for 1/2 day to Marseille visiting the old town, the market, and head towards the harbour where we will taste the bouillabaisse a local fish soup along the quays. ARLES. The town of Van Gogh.

3 nights

Arles is a charming history packed city, vibrant with its international photography exhibitions displayed throughout the city in August. A walkable distance from the hotel, stroll leisurely to see the reminiscent roman vestiges of the ancient Arena of Arles. NÎMES. The most Roman city outside Italy.

2 nights

Beautifully designed and well kept Roman city, Nîmes, has a lot to offer. Start with the Musée de la Romanité facing the arena, and continue on a guided tour of the Maison Carrée. All monuments are a walking distance from your hotel room. <https://museedelaromanite.fr/en/>

MONTPELLIER. City of the Arts.

1 night

A vibrant city with numerous bars and restaurants. Get lost in the narrow streets of the old quarter, stroll on the Esplanade built during the reign of Louis XIV. Montpellier is an international crossroads for students and the site of Europe's oldest medical school.

Here's a brief list of nearby places to visit:

PERPIGNAN

The regional capital. Highlights include: the Palace of the Kings of Majorca; Casa Xanxo (a beautiful 16th century gothic house); 'Visa Pour l'Image', the international photojournalism exhibition every September at the Couvent des Minimes; lunch on Quai Vauban.

COLLIOURE

Its magnetic beauty has attracted artists such as Matisse, Picasso, Derain. Highlights include: a spectacular view from 16th-century Fort Elme; the 800 y.o. Château Royal; the quartier Mouré; and aperitifs on the harbour!

PORT VENDRES

Lively, colourful port lined with great seafood restaurants.

BANYULS-SUR-MER

Another beautiful Côte Vermeille town. Home of the renowned 20th-century sculptor Aristide Maillol (his sculptures are all over the town); highlights include: Musée Maillol and the vineyards of the famous 'Banyuls' wines.

ALBI

Hometown of Toulouse-Lautrec and La Prouse. Highlights include Musée Toulouse-Lautrec; Sainte-Cécile Cathedral; Berbie Palace gardens; Maison du Vieil Alby – and Place Botany Bay!.

CÉRET

Céret has been home to big-name artists such as Picasso, Modigliani and Soutine. Highlights are Musée d'art moderne de Céret and hanging out where they hung out, la Grand Caf.

VILLEFRANCHE DE CONFLENT

Walled town officially classified as one of the most beautiful villages of France, Villefranche de Conflent is home to three UNESCO World Heritage Sites.

NARBONNE

Hometown of Charles Trenet, singer of 'La Mer'. Highlights include his home/museum; Les Halles; Archbishop's Palace; Cathedral of Saint-Just et Saint-Pasteur; lunch on Canal de la Robine.

CARCASSONNE

Internationally-famous walled city.

A day trip to the spectacular medieval city of Girona; the Salvador Dali's museum of Figueres, and the Empúries, coastal roman ruins on the gorgeous Costa Brava.



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
