Definitions

- “Number of Students Who Began the Program” means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who canceled during the cancellation period.
- “Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- “Number of On-time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- “On-time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- “Graduates Unavailable for Employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- “Graduates Employed in the Field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- “Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- “Number of Graduates Taking Exam” is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- “First Available Exam Date” is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- “Passage Rate” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- “Number Who Passed First Available Exam” is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- “Salary” is as reported by graduate or graduate’s employer.
- “No Salary Information Reported” is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

The student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session (first day of classes), or the seventh day after enrollment (seven days from date when enrollment agreement was signed), whichever is later. After the end of the cancellation period, the student has the right to withdraw from the College at any time and receive a pro rata refund for the part of the course not taken that was paid for in advance, less the non-refundable registration fee of one-hundred dollars (\$100), only if 60 percent or less of the course program has been completed. If more than 60 percent of the course program has been completed, no refund will be issued. This policy applies to all students and is based on scheduled hours.

School or Course Cancellation: If a course is canceled subsequent to a student's enrollment and before instruction in the course has begun, the institution will refund 100% of the tuition and fees paid, less the non-refundable registration fee of one-hundred dollars (\$100), if notice of cancellation is made through attendance of the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. If the school is permanently closed or no longer offering instruction after a student has enrolled, the school will provide a pro rata refund of tuition to the student.

REFUND POLICY

After the cancellation period, Elite Barber College provides a prorated refund of funds paid for tuition charges to students who have completed 60 percent or less of the period of attendance. Once more than 60 percent of the enrollment period in the entire course has been incurred (including absences and scheduled hours), there will be no refund to the student. If the student has paid an amount that is more than the amount owed for the time attended, then a refund will be made within 45 days of the official withdrawal date and after the student's return of any materials already provided, as applicable. If the amount owed by the student is more than the amount the student has already paid, the student must arrange to pay the amount owed to Elite Barber College as soon as possible.

The pro rata refund shall be no less than the total amount owed by the student for the portion of the course program provided, subtracted from the amount paid by the student, and is calculated as follows: The amount owed shall equal the daily charge for the program (total program charge, divided by the number of hours in the program), multiplied by the number of days the student attended, or was scheduled to attend, prior to withdrawal.

WITHDRAWAL AND CANCELLATION PROCEDURES

As prescribed by CEC 94919 (b): a notice of cancellation shall be in writing, and that a withdrawal may be effectuated by the student's written notice or by the student's conduct, including, but not necessarily limited to, a student's lack of attendance. Students who officially or unofficially withdraw from enrollment prior to course completion should:

- Provide a written notice to the school. The notice must be addressed to the school's Owner, Carrie Leal, and be delivered to Elite Barber College at 16795 Monterey Rd, Suite 150, Morgan Hill, CA 95037.
- Complete all required exit paperwork, as applicable.
- Satisfy all outstanding debts owed to the school.

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Official withdrawal date is the student's notification to the school's Owner (or co-owner), or the school's Determination.

Determination of withdrawal from school: The withdrawal date shall be the last date of recorded attendance. The student would be determined to have withdrawn from school on the earliest of:

- The date the school terminates your enrollment due to academic failure or for violation of its rules and policies stated in the catalog.
- The date you fail to attend classes for a two-week period and fail to inform the school that you are not withdrawing.
- The date you failed to return as scheduled from an approved leave of absence. The withdrawal date shall be the last date of recorded attendance. The date of the determination of withdrawal will be the scheduled date of return from LOA.
