I went to a store that sells everything, and walked up and down the isles of glitter, plastic and shine to find wrapping paper for an early gift. Driving away, I thought of the ways we display our homes and lives might be counter to the ways Jesus was born. There was no glitter among the straw. It was a quiet and humble experience, yet the most profound moment in which everything was ordered.

Plain brown recyclable paper will hold the gift of meaning this year. There are no pretenses, no fluff. The gift will be what is on the inside. The gift will be slowing down, noticing the joys and burdens of loved ones and really paying attention to show up, even when it's inconvenient or a hassle. The gift will be to pause and sit in silence to hear the voice of God speaking and to feel the embrace of assurance and comfort this gives. The gift will be to listen to those whom God hears and make room in the stable for those experiencing difficult times.

The richness of life is found in all the simple times and ways we notice how connected we are to the love of others and love of God.

May your Christmas be filled with blessings in the peace, hope, love and joy that the birth of Christ brings.

## CREATION CARE TIP OF DECEMBER

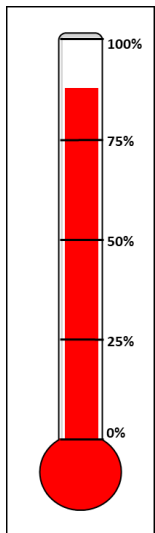
