Items Discussed:

- 1. RV Lot: There are approximately 100 spaces in the lot. A new updated lease will be mailed to all current renters. A \$100 annual maintenance fee will be due January 1st of each year.
 - There are a few spots still available at the RV Lot. Maintenance continues and there are several projects planned for the next year. Cameras will be installed for 24 hr. surveillance around the lot.
- Kitchen: Keep it clean after an event. Please take home or give away any food perishables leftover from your event. Food items like salad dressings that are bottled and can be stored and used again can be kept in the refrigerator.


