Message from the President

I am so grateful for both our core, long-term donors, who continue to give on a consistent basis, and our new donors who have joined us in our efforts to support the Living Hope Uganda orphanage. Over the years, many of you have given in response to specific initiatives as the needs arose, while others have been faithful monthly supporters. It is these monthly supporters who provide the funding needed for ongoing operational support to meet the day-to-day needs of the orphans.

We currently have only 83 of our 161 orphans sponsored, meaning the monthly orphanage operational costs of \$5,300 are only half met. I encourage all our sporadic givers to prayerfully consider sponsoring one or more orphans at \$33/month each to help us raise the funds necessary to cover the monthly operational costs of the orphanage. 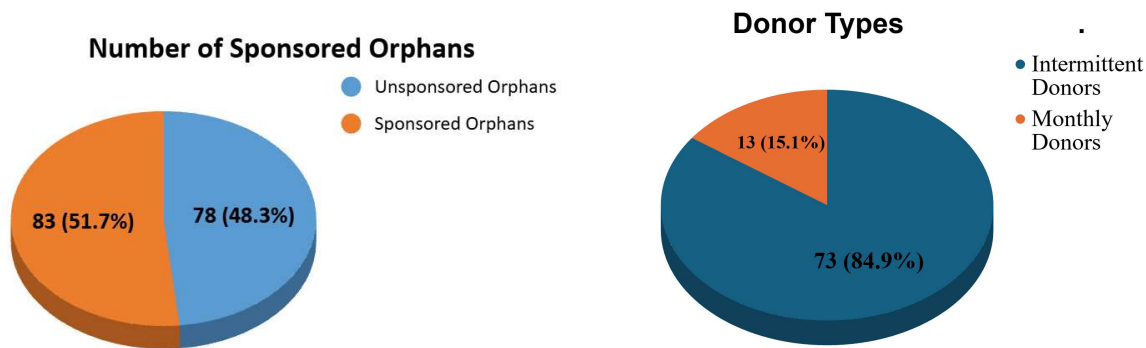
Orphanage Update

Children: As shared in an emergency email to our donor base, the orphans are at risk of the Ebola virus that has impacted Kampala, just 30-40 miles from the orphanage. We have put up an emergency Request under the Giving tab on the website to try to collect funds to send to the orphanage to buy **hand washing supplies, thermometers, disinfectant, liquid soap, sanitizer, gloves, etc.** If you can help with a donation toward this it would be greatly appreciated.

School: With 161 children of all ages, the orphanage runs its own school. In addition to the orphans, neighborhood children whose parents can afford school fees also attend the school. These fees are used to supplement the operation of the school in terms of supplies and scholarships. The second term of the year started recently and 21 of the older orphans are getting ready to write their grade 7 exams. **Please pray for them to do well.** As orphans reach their later teenage years, staff look to resettle them with families. Because they do not have funds for college, the orphanage staff are starting vocational programs offering tailoring, computing skills, cooking, metal fabrication, music, poultry farming, etc. Our goal is that every child leaves with a skill to earn a living.

Farm: **While this season's crops started out well, they are beginning to suffer because of lack of rain.** The corn grew well, but the dry spell is taking its toll on kernel production in the cobs. A lack of water means far fewer kernels in each cob and will likely result in an inadequate amount of corn to process for the orphanage's needs. We have a Farm Irrigation project on the website outlining the cost of drilling a borehole, installing larger water tanks and an irrigation system to avoid the loss of crops because of reliance on rainfall. We would greatly appreciate donations toward this project so we don't experience crop failures like this in the future. Another challenge the farm is dealing with is monkeys raiding corn and beans from the garden. The children help chase them away with scarecrows and guarding. Staff are praying for wisdom on more sustainable and effective deterrents .

Finances: This past month we were able to send \$2,580 to the Living Hope Uganda orphanage to go towards their monthly operational costs. This was an increase of over \$350 from our May donations. Unfortunately, that still left the orphanage over \$2,700 short of its monthly needs. Because monthly operational support donations are directed first at food sustainability and then at staff (cooks, security, caretakers, farm manager, etc.), it means the orphanage did not have the funds to pay its teachers again. We are praying for more donors to step up and commit to sponsoring orphans on a monthly basis so we can start paying the teachers consistently. As you can see from the charts below, a handful of only 13 donors are providing the monthly support for over 80 orphans. **We are asking the rest of our donor base to please consider committing to monthly giving.**



Projects:

While our current fundraising campaign is focused on monthly Orphan Sponsorships, we welcome any one-time donations towards our three main projects: an irrigation system for the farm, new bedding for the orphans, and security gates for the orphanage. We have a number of other initiatives that also need funding (like latrines, vocational training workspace and equipment, etc.), but until we can fund the current three projects listed on the website, we will not be putting them up on the website at this time.

NOTE: All LHMFB Board members are volunteers and 100% of your donations (less any bank/credit card processing fees) go directly to supporting the Living Hope Uganda orphanage.
