2020 Measurable Results

- ◆ 350 mothers were assisted through Community Grab & Go Drive Up Events and Better Us Support Groups
- ◆ 210 babies received services through the Prenatal Care (PNCC) and Childcare Coordination (CCC)
- ◆ 95% of healthy babies were born at 40 weeks and weighed over 5.5 lbs.

It is our desire to provide supportive services to mothers and their babies that would enhance parenting and contribute to healthy living. The aim of our Prenatal Care (PNCC) and Childcare Coordination (CCC) Services is to encourage, inspire, and introduce mothers to community partners for resources. The goals of the PNCC/CCC Services are (1) to bring awareness on the free community resources that are available for them, (2) provide educational classes to foster a healthy lifestyle, (3) pamper and shower them with love, (4) give them *Hope* as they set attainable and realistic goals. In addition to our PNCC/CCC Services, mothers have the opportunity to network with our community partners and mingle with other single mothers during our free community events.

New Partnership

ODB partnered with *WeRise Doula Program* to support and increase healthy births through Doula Service. The goal of this partnership is to work collectively to minimize low-birth rates and provide breastfeeding training.
