Capturing the Colors of Autumn

To those of us tuned to the natural world, summer has turned into fall. Now is a good time to up your photography game to make amazing fall images. Here are 9 ideas for how to do just that.

- **1. Push yourself.** Get out of your comfort zone. Play with saturation; darken the background; add a touch of blur, etc. Try something new!
- **2. Know the secret.** Creating a spectacular display comes down to the weather conditions: cool nights, warm sunny days, and sufficient rainfall.
- **3. Visit the web.** Numerous websites monitor the location of peak colors in your area.
- **4. Look for the fog.** Fog molds the autumn light into something spectacular. Plan ahead by watching for warm air over cool ground; get up early before the fog burns off shortly after sunrise.
- **5. No presets or scenes.** These camera settings take the decision making out of your hands. Take back control; experiment!
- **6. Filter the light.** A circular polarizing (CP) filter reduces glare, boosts contrast, and intensifies colors.
- **7. Use a tripod.** A tripod will steady your camera and allow for slower shutter speeds and lower ISO, which are keys to managing depth of field, keeping more of the landscape in focus.
- **8. Try photo editing software.** You can create your own interpretation of your photo. Some popular software are Adobe Lightroom or Photoshop.
- **9. Search for the unusual.** Search for fall color in unusual places. The porch of an historic house can hold beauty just as well a forest thick with trees.
