From Chris Tanner: Art Museum's Mysterious Collection

During a May auto-tour of Netherlands, my wife and I discovered "Art Museum De Buitenplaats," featuring a complex work by <u>Tjibbe Hooghiemstra</u>. This single acre of artistic energy quietly dominates the cultural center of the rural town of Paterswolde, and is not particularly noticeable. It has a modest if dramatic display building, an equally modest 17th century home, a café and a cleverly designed sculpture garden.

Hooghiemstra's show is an artist-supervised installation of 115 related pieces of different media, 10 brief statements (in Dutch) and several themes that tie it together. The dominant medium is pencil or ink drawings on yellowed paper cut from antique financial, legal and scientific documents, here presented as small studies and some large collages. No frames, no titles, nothing for sale; only a few are memorable. It is a mysterious collection that made me ask, "What is he trying to share, and how is he using this strange display to get there?"

The artist is probably compensated from ticket sales and government grants, but I saw no evidence of sponsorship. This is a miniature Chicago Art Institute in that it engages an entire community and a handful of outsiders; in the US, it might only be found in universities.

The museum, grounds and installation are an invitingly open experience to ponder and discuss over café coffee and pie as townspeople of all ages bike by on brick-paved streets.

From Ernest Schweit: Update




Two shows this month after long trip to AZ
