Monthly Competition Rules

What is our monthly competition?

Members can bring a single art piece to an in-person meeting to compete and possibly win a ribbon. The guest artist will judge the art and winners will be featured in our newsletter, *Sketches*.

Rules

Are you aware that there are rules for our monthly competitions? Members can access the information that governs our organization on the <u>LCAL website</u> under "About" and then under "Bylaws and Constitution." Copied below are the rules as stated in the "Policies and Procedures" section:

Monthly Competitions

- Work must have been completed within the past 3 years and not have been entered in any other monthly competitions.
- 2. One piece per member. To qualify for a ribbon, it must comply with the theme, if any.
- 3. Monthly Competition ribbons shall be awarded, based on the number of entries:
 - 1-5: 1 ribbon
 - 6-10: 2 ribbons
 - 11-15: 3 ribbons
 - etc.

Art Notes, by Ernest Schweit

Interview with Phil Schorn

Long-time LCAL member Phil Schorn is an accomplished colored pencil artist, instructor and author. He's constantly on the go.

If he's not showing his work at an art fair, he's teaching a class somewhere, or giving a demo at a local arts group.

His stunning renderings have been shown at local galleries and art centers, and during the warmer months, you can find him on the art show circuit.

I've known him for years, so I know what I'm talking about when I say he's also one of the nicest guys around.

Q: How would you describe your art?

A: "Details" I want the viewer to see more than they thought was there. I extract a portion of what I'm seeing to make it come off the page. I take what is ordinary and make it extraordinary.

Q: What is your process; how do you make your art?

A: Using the color pencil gives me the ability to put on paper what I want to see. It is a medium that requires patience. Since the pencil is small, you draw small. It is a layering process of color on a smooth paper to create the effects and details I want.

Q: How did you get started?

A: I always did some drawing. In High School, I had an art teacher that pushed me to do more with my art. He helped me get my art in order to submit to colleges. I was offered an art scholarship to Eastern Illinois University. I double majored in 2D Fine Art and Commercial Art.

After college I worked for a couple different printers as a graphic artist. Then in 1993, I decided to go on my own as a selfemployed graphic artist. I incorporated as "PS Graphics Inc." in 1995 and used the corporation for my art.

In the early 2000's I was a judge for the 4H art entries at the Lake County Fair I was a judge for about 12 years. I got to talk with the kids about their art. Seeing the quality of what they were creating, and I'm like "why am I not doing this?" So, I started some drawings and by 2016, I was featured in Color Pencil Magazine. The first of several publications.

In 2018, I was challenged with cancer and I decided to make the change - because life is too short. In 2019, I published my first book of my art. I slowly distanced myself from the design side and worked more on my own art. Since that time, I have done gallery shows, workshops, classes and 80+ outdoor art shows.

Q: What/who is your inspiration and why?

A: I see inspiration everywhere; you just have to look.

Q: What does your art mean to you?

A: My art gives me a sense of calm and relaxation. Whether a piece takes me 10 hours or a few hundred hours is irrelevant in the process.

When I get pictures of my art on a wall by the purchaser, expressing what it means to them, that is what makes it worthwhile.

Ongoing Shows

 Big night for 10 LCAL artists at "Wall Flowers" It was a glorious opening on March 22 of "Wall Flowers" at the <u>Blue Moon Gallery</u> in Grayslake. Exhibiting artists were: Maureen Fisher Rivkin, Erin Galbraith, Aleksa Lederer, Oliver Merriam, Linda Rodriquez, Sandra Saxton, Susan Schneider, Phil Schorn, and yours truly.

Of the 150 pieces submitted to the show in 30 different mediums, 69 were selected from 64 artists in IL and WI.



A big crowd jammed the gallery until it closed around 9pm.

If you missed opening night, **the show runs through April 27. Gallery hours:** 1-4pm, Saturdays. In addition, it will be open 1-4pm on Sun., April 27 for the show.

This year's Selection Committee are LCAL members Oliver Merriam, Mary Neely, and Roger Shule.


Who is Invited? All LCAL members and their family and friends. Enjoy the students' creative works. Your presence will support LCAL's mission to promote the visual arts in Lake County.
