Event focuses on protecting children from trafficking predators

Pioche played host to a childtrafficking prevention and online safety education event for parents, where attendees took the "Lincoln Lookout Pledge."

"I pledge to do my part in keeping the children of Lincoln County safe. I will promote a positive community through action. I am a Lincoln County lookout. If I see something, I say something."

Held March 25 at the Overland Hotel & Saloon conference room, the event included a barbecue dinner provided by the Historic Silver Café. Attendees learned from Dottie Laster, who has led Department of Justice-funded task forces in Texas and California. Her work triggered the largest rescue of human trafficking victims in U.S. history in 2005.

Laster discussed ways to protect kids online, prevent trafficking and prepare for missing person events. She shared sobering statistics on human trafficking and child trafficking.

In a letter to the Record following the event, Laster said, "The

community is rural; however, the intersection of interactive applications and a nearby highway easily allows a message that starts out online to quickly become in-person and dangerous. Each victim may be worth over \$300,000 a year to a predator. They will put in the effort to lure, groom and take teens and young adults into their predatory schemes."

At the event, Laster provided guidance to parents on measures they can take to protect children, including being very aware of all digital activities their children participate in.

"I give you permission to spy on your kids, and if they get upset, you can send them to me," she said.

She added that the time to start a proactive plan for protecting kids is now. To start looking at these things when a child is missing is too late.

Laster asked the audience to be on the lookout for unwanted contact from any adult with their children online.

She spoke about the Digital DNA kit that she developed to help gather data of places kids frequent online. If they go missing, and the parents

have this data, it can lead to locating them. More info is available at https://tinyurl.com/digitaldnakit

The event was organized by community member Jessica Hernandez, who is passionate about creating positive outcomes for children. A strong supporter of the new local Boys & Girls Club, Hernandez seeks to provide education for parents as well as safe environments for kids.

"Through attending the Lincoln County Coalition meetings, I've really seen the need for activities that youth can participate in," Hernandez said, later adding, "I've really become aware of how helpful the Boys & Girls Club can be."

In that spirit, proceeds from the event were donated to the Boys & Girls Club in Lincoln County to assist with transportation needs. A dinner purchase provided options of ribs, chicken, brisket, mac and cheese and other comfort foods. T-

shirt sales and over 200 sold raffle tickets rounded out the proceeds. Raffle prizes included a Jay Allensigned portrait, two Boys & Girls Club Shirts and one kids hoodie signed by Jay Allen, two tickets to the upcoming Tom Bennet concert, a barbecue dinner from Get Sauced NV, original artwork, a five-piece Frontier Living kitchen set, a photoshoot gift certificate, a hand-

Pioche Chamber of Commerce News

Members of the Pioche Chamber of Commerce met online on Tuesday, after the March 14 meeting was rescheduled to allow for attendance at the Lincoln County Authority of Tourism focus session in Caliente.

Jason Beam discussed recent Chamber business during the President's Report. The chamber's member mixer and social media seminar was canceled mid-week due to flooding concerns. The President's Report concluded with the announcement of Beam's participation in the first Labor Day Committee meeting of the year on March 13. Meetings to discuss the 118th Annual Labor Day celebration will take place monthly at Thompson's Opera House in Pioche.

Chamber of Commerce members discussed ideas for new Pioche merchandise and ways to highlight the 150th Anniversary of Thompson's Opera House during Labor Day festivities. The building opened Sept. 16, 1873 as Brown's Hall for public dances and social meetings. After six years, Arthur Thompson purchased the building and enhanced the entertainment venue.

The public meeting space turned theater once sold "Pioche's finest liquors and cigars," along with hay and other essentials, in the downstairs general store. The Chamber is hoping to restore and rearrange some spaces to help display the building's long history to the influx of visitors expected this summer.

The meeting concluded after members discussed plans for the upcoming Tom Bennett concert. Pioche Chamber of Commerce members will continue planning for a tour of the town during the artist's visit. The one-man band will be bringing country blues to Thompson's Opera House at 8 p.m. on April 15. Show tickets will be available for \$20 at the door.

Lincoln County Coalition introduces new director during March 28 meeting

The March 28 meeting of the Lincoln County Coalition (LCC) commenced with attendee introductions and comments.

Dr. Donald Deever of the UNR Extension announced the availability of radon home testing kits. There is no known safe level of exposure to radon. One in three homes in Lincoln County and one in two homes in Panaca have levels above what the EPA recommends. Those interested in obtaining a kit can visit the UNR Lincoln Extension office at 360 Lincoln St. in Caliente or call (775) 726-3109 for more information.

Veterans advocate Linda Rollins will be in the office at the Panaca Senior Center from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Friday, April 14. Additionally, a second advocate is currently being trained to help assist veterans in the

Recently hired Coalition Director Tracie Duren joined the meeting remotely to discuss the 10-year Drug-Free Communities Grant. Specific goals over the 10-year period relate to the reduction of alcohol and marijuana misuse and abuse by youth, and eventually, adults. Mary Rose Parkman, Coalition and Community Building Manager for NyE Communities Coalition (NyECC), shared how NyECC will assist with the first steps of the grant initiative and data collection. The Wilder Collaboration Factors Inventory Survey is a tool used to identify possible strengths and weaknesses in an organization and the collaboration throughout the lifespan of a project. Jess Rosner, a data analyst for NyECC, will be visiting with Duren and a team to plan the implementation of the survey early next month.

Hayley Gloeckner, Crystal Dineley and Amber Pike provided an update on recent NyECC-led initiatives in the Lincoln County community. Naloxone training is continuing, with Panaca Elementary School staff and Meadow Valley Middle School staff being educated on assisting with opioid overdose. Activities, food, sponsors and raffle prizes were announced for the March 30 Teen Night, and plans are being discussed for additional Teen Night events hosted by NyECC later in the

Travis Constantine and Mark Jacoby were present to discuss the Boys & Girls Club of Truckee Meadows servicing Lincoln County. Program Director Constantine shared that with the recent improvements in weather, attendance has been higher than previous weeks. More students visit the club on Friday, and once school has let out for summer vacation, participation is expected to grow. Director of Frontier Operations and Development Mark Jacoby thanked NyECC for a recent \$8,000 grant to sponsor the program. The grant was awarded as a sub-grant through the NyECC Substance Abuse Primary Prevention Grant program. Funds from the grant are being applied toward Positive

Action Curriculum materials and funding to staff the program. Constantine and Jacoby also announced the recent purchase of a bounce house, trailer and generators for use in Lincoln County. Staff plans to hold future club events, fundraisers and public outreach using the new bounce house.

Meadow Valley Middle School student leaders Bodie Anderson, Hayley Medlin and Michael Heath joined Principal Dr. Michael Roth in presenting ideas for helping youth avoid developing unhealthy habits. Agriculture, robotics, space exploration and hydroponics were all mentioned as potential areas of focus. Roth shared that through the Coalition's efforts, he hopes to continue helping youth access programs with a potential for career development.

Lana Chouquer with Lincoln County Workforce was appointed Coalition Treasurer after a motion and second from board members. Coalition President September Barnes announced that with the director and treasurer positions now filled, the 501c3 nonprofit paperwork can be completed. Once submitted, approval is expected within 30 days.

The LCC subcommittee for Youth and Community will hold a virtual meeting at 10 a.m. April 13. Meetings are being scheduled for the Behavioral Health and the Infrastructure and System Development subcommittees. The next meeting of the Lincoln County Coalition will take place April 25 at 10 a.m. in the Panaca Town Center.

Internet assistance available

The Affordable connectivity Program (ACP) is part of a bipartisan law that, according to a White House statement, "provides eligible households \$30 per month off their internet bills. ACP-eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers."

To get this process started, apply through the FCC website, then connect a participating internet service provider.

Assistance for new farmers and ranchers becomes available to public

The Beginning Farmer and Rancher Development Program aims to help new entrepreneurs who want to get into these fields with education and financial assistance.

Opportunities like this have been available since the mid-1800s, but the Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008 allocated over \$75 million toward these efforts. Most recently, The

Agriculture Improvement Act of 2018 (the 2018 Farm Bill) also added to these opportunities, so now anyone who wants to get into ranching and farming and qualifies for the service can draw from the resources available through these programs

According to the USDA, the qualifications are: "The recipient must be a collaborative, state, tribal, local, or regionally-based network or partnership of public or private entities, which may include: state cooperative extension service; community-based and nongovernmental organization; college or university (including institutions awarding associate degrees); or any other appropriate partner. Others may be eligible to apply."

Those interested in learning more need to move quickly; the application process ends on April 27. But, if approved, the USDA estimates that applicants can receive anywhere from \$49,000 to \$750,000. It also estimates that only 25 percent of applications receive funding, but its total funding for everyone approved will be somewhere in the ballpark of \$28 million.




