

Directions to Tour Starting at Licking River EQ Tank:

From I-75/I-71, Downtown Cincinnati

- Head south on I-471 towards Kentucky;
- Take Exit 2 towards Southgate, turn onto Alexandria Pk;
- Take sharp left onto Moock Rd, continue for ~1.7-miles
- Turn left onto Licking Pike, continue for ~0.2-miles;
- Turn right onto South St, continue for ~ 0.1 -miles;
- Turn left onto Andrews Way, continue for ~0.2-miles;
- Licking River EQ Tank located at western terminus.
- · Parking available along street and in adjacent gravel lot.



Directions to Highland Heights and Silver Grove EQ Tanks:

- Head east on Moock Rd for ~1.7-miles;
- Turn right onto Alexandria Pk/US-27, continue for ~0.9-miles;
- Turn left onto Grandview Dr, continue for ~0.2-miles;
- Turn left onto Ft. Thomas Ave, continue for ~0.2-miles;
- Turn right onto River Rd, continue for ~1-mile;
- Turn right onto KY-445/Mary Ingles Hwy,
- Highland Heights EQ located at intersection of Blangley Rd;
- Silver Grove EQ located at intersection of Lois Ln
- Parking on street available

Directions to MSGDC-Wastewater Engineering Building:

- Head north on I-471;
- Take exit 6A for US-50 S toward I-71/I-75/Third St;
- Keep left and merge onto US-50 W;
- Continue on US-50 W towards River Rd;
- Turn Right onto Evans St and continue ~0.4-miles;

their discharges and meet appropriate limits. The Kao team members exhibit a passion for "doing the right thing" and support the teamwork needed to accomplish this objective.


Seven presentations provided information on a variety of subjects and included:
