Every year SWOWEA and each of the other sections gather nominations that can be submitted to OWEA for the state awards. There are a total of 15 awards given out each year at the state conference. As a section we often re-nominate candidates that scored well in the previous year but did not win. This year we are only looking for candidates for the following six awards:

- FD Stewart Award Outstanding plant operations, maintenance, reporting, and records management.
- Public Service Elected official or officials demonstrating significant commitment to the water environment; candidates are not required to be OWEA members.
- Collections Management of a collection system demonstrating excellence and professionalism.
- Engineering Excellence The focus of this award is on a project. The selected project must have been in operation for a period of one year and not more than five years.
- Facility Image Enhancement of physical image of our profession as viewed by the general public
- WEF William D Hatfield Operators of wastewater treatment plants for outstanding performance and professionalism.

Some background information on the candidate will be needed. The awards committee will help the nominator in assembling the information on the nominee. Please consider nominating someone you know.
