These programs are all critical to the health and welfare of the City by ensuring regulatory compliance with regulations and applicable permits. This position will supervise, establish, maintain, and implement processes, procedures, and documentation to assist all operations in maintaining full compliance with all environmental laws, regulations, permit requirements and conditions, and City policy. The position will monitor and ensure all departmental reporting requirements, certifications, reports, and notifications are completed and filed in accordance with regulatory requirements. Maintain knowledge of legislative and regulatory changes directly applicable to the division of Sewers and Drains and in coordination with the Department of Public Utilities Regulatory Management Section. Work directly with their supervised staff to ensure their sections' operational and personnel needs are being met. Review and approve operating budgets of the supervised groups, and assist with or manage special projects as assigned.
