Under general direction, this full-time position will assist in developing, marketing, and the administering all programs for the reuse of wastewater treatment biosolids products be responsible for coordinating the work of others and examining samples of industrial waste, wastewater, stormwater, sludge, and other residuals for compliance with governmental regulations. Typical duties may include supervising employees to include signing performance evaluations, approving leaves, and recommending disciplinary actions; Overseeing and training laboratory staff in prescribed laboratory techniques and performance of routine tests; Preparing and reviewing periodic reports and data required by regulatory agencies and requested by management; Designing and implementing research projects to recommend changes in laboratory procedures and equipment used; Performing gravimetric, volumetric, biochemical, physical, instrumental and biological analyses of samples; Maintaining chemical inventory and initiating purchase orders for the laboratory; Preparing chemicals, reagents and standards for laboratory and plant use; Reviewing and maintaining data and records for the laboratory such as for laboratory information system, chemical hygiene plan, safety data sheets for chemicals, and laboratory manuals; Collecting samples for laboratory analyses at various locations and Determining chemical dosages for plant operations monitoring biosolids distribution to a variety of beneficial reuse locations and managing their associated third party contracts; keeping record of, providing reports on and compiling data for biosolids reuse and Com-Til compost sales; marketing of the city's biosolids program and the sales of the Com Til compost product; provide public education regarding the Com Til compost product; perform public outreach regarding the use and benefits of the city's biosolids products; investigate complaints, prepare and recommend responses to inquires; and analyzing samples and operating records to expand the use of biosolids and compost materials within the city of Columbus and surrounding communities..
