




Timeline Breakdown




Night of the event

 - Massive fire demanding a lot of water
- Evacuation of homes
- Road Closures
- Massive Response
- What was on the train?












Emergency Response February-March

Steps Taken:

Facilities checked every 4 hours

- Sanitary Sewer System
- Distribution System
- Wastewater treatment facility
- Water treatment facility




Emergency Response

February-March

Steps Taken:

- Sentinel Wells (4)-IMMEDIATELY
- Water Plant Sampling
- Private Well Sampling


