Artist Statement:

"I'm an artist who was diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder as an adult. Growing up and being forced to "fit in" certainly had its challenges within my family as well as the community in general. It left me largely misunderstood in so many ways. When I began drawing, it opened a whole new outlet of communication for me, one without projection, discrimination, or prejudice. I found that my greatest form of communication is creating art. Through painting, drawing and other forms of artistic expression I am able to communicate my thoughts and emotions in a way that feels natural and comfortable. When I am not creating art, you can find me assisting Carson, a disabled young man with Smith-Lemi-Opitz syndrome, helping the elderly with their daily household tasks or taking care of pets while their owners are away. In addition, I love to cook, mostly international dishes (Pakistani, Mexican, Middle Eastern) and am fluid in Spanish and English languages."Sue Reeves
