Joshua Whitehouse (aka Jowybean) is a freelance illustrator, character designer, storyboard and comic artist. He began exhibiting at the age of nine with Disabled Art of London.

Joshua began exhibiting at the age of nine with Disabled Art in London. The framer in Birmingham was so blown away by his drawings that he showed them to a local gallery owner Lee Benson at *Number Nine the Gallery* in Brindley Place Birmingham who staged numerous exhibitions for Josh. There he met and drew for a number of celebrities including Rick Wakeman. He was the official artist for the opening of Millennium Point where he met the Queen who also owns his artwork. He also raised money for the fire fighters of New York after 9/11.

Joshua was assessed by Professor Hemlin and her team – who had assessed Stephen Wiltshire - and found to be an art savant. He was featured in a South Korean documentary and also appeared on *Autistic Superstars*, a BBC documentary where he drew live in the studio. His work varies from character design to world building to his own idiosyncratic portraits. He can work in digital and on canvas or paper with pen or pencil. He has Joshua has also worked on a comic – *Humanization.com*.

With support he attended Matthew Boulton College and the City of Birmingham University where he studied Illustration and has worked freelance since leaving; most notably for independent film makers working on the Disney and Lego *Frozen* short. He recently worked with the Princes Trust and Prince Charles also owns a drawing by Josh.
