Advent Theme: "This same Jesus...will come again"

Week One: Are You Ready?

Text: Matthew 24:36-44

In a world full of uncertainty, is it truly possible to be prepared? For many, being ready means planning for peaceful moments. That includes budgeting carefully, securing their homes, and ensuring sufficient security. However, history shows us that doing all these things doesn't guarantee safety; it might help, but it doesn't make us completely safe. Mara, a high school teacher, used to think that planning for disasters was the best way to be prepared. But she soon realized that all her precautions couldn't stop Mother Nature from destroying her home. Even though she had nowhere to call her own, her neighbors came to her rescue and offered her a place to stay.

Years later, when Mara grew old, she asked to be buried beneath the chapel bell of the school. "Let my bones remind you," she said, "that readiness is not about knowing what comes next. It's about showing up with love."

"Therefore, you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour" (Matthew 24:44). These words mark the start of our Advent season. Let us prepare for Christ's return by demonstrating love.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, unless you prepare us, we can never be ready. Prepare us to come with love. Amen.

This child then said their mom was home but asked if I could come in as she wasn't able to come to the door. As I entered the not so elegant home, I noticed there was no tree or decorations. Upon reaching the living room I found a young woman who was not in the best of health and there in the room with her was a young child in a wheel chair. After getting the needed signature I slowly made my way out to my truck again.

I was tired of delivering packages that I knew were Christmas gifts and goodies, but this package made me realize that I had so much to be thankful for. I still wonder to this day what became of that family and what their whole story was. All I know is that it changed my attitude about Christmas. I don't know if the light of Christ was shining in that household that year but it definitely made me think of how I needed to make the light of Christ shine through my life.

Once again, I have probably made this statement before, but on December 25th we will observe the birth of our savior. However, we should celebrate Christmas each day of the year.

As you observe all of the decorative lights of the season, remember to let your light shine as you never know when your life may be the only Bible that some people read. Have a very Merry Christmas!


YOUTH MENS


















We are THANKFUL!
