



### **Liberia Mission School Summer 2025 Update**

The students at the New Dawn Learning Center in Liberia are currently on summer break and will return in September for the second year in the new school. Enrollment for the 2025 - 2026 school year is estimated at between 75 - 100 students.

Your support, through donations of money and supplies, has made a significant impact in the lives of these children from low-income neighborhoods. They receive education, a meal, and a safe place to go each day in a Christ-centered environment. There is also time to have fun, as shown below during a national holiday, when they dressed in traditional clothing.

The current challenge is finding space for the 7th grade class, as funding was not sufficient to complete the roof on the new building section before the torrential rains that typically start in July. The good news is that the roof beams are now in place and ready when the roofing materials can be purchased and installed.

Please keep the students and staff at the New Dawn Learning Center in your prayers as they look forward to the new school year to begin.




