A Step Back

It can be difficult to get the most out of the Scriptures when we don't know what's coming up in church. Going into church without knowing what the Sunday readings are about often means we have to scramble, mentally, to figure out what the theme of the day is and what we should be thinking about. Taking a step back can often help us understand what a Church season is about and give us a better understanding of the readings we hear in worship.

We have come through Advent and Christmas. And there we expect to hear about the coming of Jesus and then His birth in Bethlehem. But after Christmas we move on to Epiphany. Epiphany begins a new season, one where we focus on the early life and ministry of Jesus.

Epiphany begins with the coming of the magi to visit young Jesus. They find Jesus in the house with Mary and offer their gifts. Although they avoid going back to Herod and return to their country by a different rout, Herod still seeks to kill the Christ. He has all the boy babies in Bethlehem killed who are two years old and younger. A reminder that the Christ enters a world filled will sin and death.

Epiphany continues with the Baptism of Jesus. We skip over the young life of Jesus and move right on to the beginning of Jesus' ministry. As Jesus is baptized by John, He comes out of the water and the heavens are opened. The Father's voice and Spirit's descent show us that Jesus is the one who is anointed without sins to bear them all to the tree for us.

Epiphany continues with the ups and downs of Jesus' ministry. The first miracle at Cana in Galilee seems like a high point. How amazing that Jesus turns water into wine! But then we hear that Jesus is rejected by those who knew Him so well in Nazareth. Jesus shows those in the synagogue that He is the Christ, but they refuse to believe.

Jesus continues to perform miracles, driving out a demon and then giving the miraculous catch of fish. Epiphany reminds us that Jesus is true God. Only God could do such miracles and the signs that Jesus does gives validation to His claims of being the Christ. Thus, the teachings of Jesus should be heeded. Epiphany 6 and 7 find Jesus teaching the crowds. He gives them practical advice, but this all applies to Himself. He is the one who is poor in spirit and thus blessed. He is the one who loves His enemies, even to death.

The final Sunday before Lent is the transfiguration of Jesus. This is the culmination of the entire season of Epiphany. Jesus is the light of the world! The magi follow the star to find Jesus, but He is the true light. But even the transfiguration is not the true light that Jesus has come to being. As Jesus walks off the transfiguration mount the disciples follow Him as He journeys on to die. Epiphany gives way to Lent. Jesus journeys on to be rejected, suffer and die for the sins of sinners.

It is my hope that this little description of the Epiphany season gives you a better understanding of where we are headed. I hope that you will be able to get more out of the Sunday readings as we hear them together in worship. I have broken out the Sundays in Epiphany below that you can follow along in your Bible at home. In Jesus,

SYMBOLS

The focal point of our church is the chancel. The most prominent feature is the stained glass window showing Mary weeping in the garden for the tomb was empty where Jesus was laid to rest. Jesus approaches her. She thought that HE was the gardener and asked if he carried Jesus' body away. Mary Jesus in Aramaic to "Rabboni", which means teacher. She recognizes Jesus. Jesus tells her to go and tell the disciples that she saw HIM. The window scene is from the Gospel of John, Chapter 20, verses 11 through 18.

Another symbol on the chancel is the engraved figure (altar front) of a lamb, the lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. He was born to be sacrificed on the tree to redeem the world for all their sins, for the love of humanity. Jesus knew that He had to be sacrificed, as it is stated in the Gospel of Matthew 16:21. How appropriate Jesus that represented in the engraved lamb, elements the two communion are placed on this altar. More referrals can be found in the following: John 1:29-34, John 10:11, John 19:31-37, Luke: 15:1-7, Revelation 5.

Council Meeting January 13

Elders: Discussion on the possibility of removing pews for easier access at communion for those unable to take the stairs. It was recommended to notify an elder or usher so the pastor can bring communion to the pew. It was also noted that those unable to take stairs may opt to sit in the front pew.
