

While some were speaking of the temple, how it was adorned with noble stones and offerings, [Jesus] said, ⁶"As for these things that you see, the days will come when there will not be left here one stone upon another that will not be thrown down." ⁷And they asked him, "Teacher, when will these things be, and what will be the sign when these things are about to take place?" ⁸And he said, "See that you are not led astray. For many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he!' and, 'The time is at hand!' Do not go after them. ⁹And when you hear of wars and tumults, do not be terrified, for these things must first take place, but the end will not be at once."

¹⁰Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. ¹¹There will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and pestilences. And there will be terrors and great signs from heaven. 12 But before all this they will lay their hands on you and persecute you, delivering you up to the synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors for my name's sake. 13This will be your opportunity to bear witness. ¹⁴Settle it therefore in your minds not to meditate beforehand how to answer. ¹⁵for I will give you a mouth and wisdom, which none of your adversaries will be able to withstand or contradict. ¹⁶You will be delivered up even by parents and brothers and relatives and friends, and some of you they will put to death. ¹⁷You will be hated by all for my name's sake. ¹⁸But not a hair of your head will perish. ¹⁹By your endurance you will gain your lives.

²⁰"But when you see Jerusalem surrounded by armies, then know that its desolation has come near. ²¹Then let those who are in Judea flee to the mountains, and let those who are inside the city depart, and let not those who are out in the country enter it, ²²for these are days of vengeance, to fulfill all that is written. ²³Alas for women who are pregnant and for those who are nursing infants in those days! For there will be great distress upon the earth and wrath against this people. ²⁴They will fall by the edge of the sword and be led captive among all nations, and Jerusalem will be trampled underfoot by the Gentiles, until the times of the Gentiles are fulfilled.

²⁵"And there will be signs in sun and moon and stars, and on the earth distress of nations in perplexity because of the roaring of the sea and the waves, ²⁶people fainting with fear and with foreboding of what is coming on the world. For the powers of the heavens will be shaken. ²⁷And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. ²⁸Now when these things begin to take place, straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near."

Redemption

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

What does this mean?

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the virgin Mary, is my Lord, who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity. This is most certainly true.



Love Prompts Giving

Giving is a natural expression of love. If we dearly love and give ourselves to others, we will do everything possible not to forget occasions or opportunities to share with those individuals. Loving spouses show their love for one



another without any limitation or constraint. The young man who loves his girlfriend never thinks he has given enough to her. Parents who love their children will give whatever they can to contribute to their well-being. Followers of Christ who love Him know no limits to their giving. Thus, we joyfully give to God our hearts as well as our money. Since our hearts are opened by the Holy Spirit, we will grow spiritually and desire to give.

God is concerned with more than the giver's gift. He is more concerned with the love of the giver. We are to give because we love the one to whom we give. Paul wrote about the importance of love in 1 Corinthians 13:3: "If I give all I have, and if I deliver up my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing." We need to monitor our motives for giving. Is it recognition we seek? Are we giving for tax reasons? Are we giving to fulfill an obligation or to "pay a pledge"? Do we hope to earn God's favor with our giving? Giving is intimately connected with the conditions of our spiritual lives. In the story of the poor widow (Luke 21:1-4), the widow gave all that she had out of love for and trust in Jesus, whereas the wealthy gave their leftovers in a very public display to receive undue recognition.

We place our money in the offering plate as an act of worship. We are not just giving money; we are witnessing to our faith in God. We are agreeing with God that He can take care of us, that He will not let us flounder on our own, but that He will always be with us to provide for our needs. Our giving is a way to show our appreciation to God for the greatest gift of all—our redemption.
