Faith as a Mustard Seed

He said to them, "Because of your little faith. For truly, I say to you, if you have faith like a grain of mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move, and nothing will be impossible for you." – Matthew 17.20

At CTK school has begun! Kids are back in class and teachers are teaching already. Every school year we wrap the year around a particular verse from Scripture, our theme verse. This year our verse is Matthew 17.20. This verse sounds simple, have a little faith – faith like a mustard seed and nothing will be impossible. But there is a little more going on here.

Before this Jesus had taken Peter, James, and John on that mountain and Jesus was transfigured before them. The three disciples were shocked as Jesus shone, the Father spoke, the cloud covered, and Moses and Elijah appeared. Was this about making structures for Moses, Elijah, and Jesus? Was this about Jesus being strong enough to drive out the Romans? Matthew gives us a clue as to what God was doing for His disciples. When Moses and Elijah are gone, when the cloud is no more, and the Father's voice is silent the disciples see Jesus only.

While they were on the mountain the other disciples were out working. They were teaching and driving out demons, or trying to drive out demons. A man comes up to Jesus saying that his son is possessed by an evil spirit and the disciples were not able to drive it out. Jesus replies, "O faithless and twisted generation, how long am I to be with you? How long am I to bear with you (Matthew 17.17a)?" Who is this faithless generation? The crowd or maybe the father of the boy or perhaps the disciples. Jesus drive out the demon with a word.

But the disciples inquire why they couldn't drive out the demon. And Jesus speaks our theme verse. If only they had faith like a mustard seed. The mustard seed was known to be one of the smallest seeds, which grew into a large plant. Their faith was not strong like a mature plant, it wasn't growing like a sapling, it wasn't even a seed! They had no faith. They couldn't move a demon, let alone a mountain!

But there is more. In the next section Matthew records Jesus telling the disciples, "The Son of Man is about to be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him, and he will be raised on the third day (Matthew 17.22-23)." The disciples are distressed for they have no faith nor trust in Jesus. But Jesus does have faith. He trusts the Father. Jesus is transfigured to show the disciples that He has faith. He will travel the way the Father has set out for Him and let nothing turn Him away from that course. Jesus is able to drive out demons with a word, heal the sick, forgive sinners, and even move something heavier than mountains.

As Jesus focuses on going to the cross and dying He shoulders a heavy burden, your sin. Heavier than any mountain range is this burden! He suffers the consequence of our sin on the tree. He faithfully takes all the Father's wrath against sin. He is transformed into our sin for us. Jesus bears with us amid our sins and unfaithfulness. He comes to us in our lives and grants us what we need – faith in Him. This is given through our Baptism into Him. He washes sins away and gives faith. As we abide in Him that faith grows. It flourishes as we are in His Word and worship. It grows into a strong and abiding tree, which nothing can shake. That others would see and marvel at the goodness and mercy of God.

This is what we do at CTK, teach the faith. It is the focus of our school. Amid academics and sports, we teach Christ that our students would have a strong faith in their Savior. That our kids would know all that Jesus has done for them. He has died for them and grants them faith to trust in Him during the storms of life. As we begin a new year we remember again our purpose at CTK – to teach Christ. Please keep our school, teachers, and students in your prayers as we being this school year. How blessed we are to be able to reach so many in Christ!

<u>1 John 4:1</u> - Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, for many false prophets have gone out into the world.

We've been hearing a lot about false prophets lately in sermons, and at least I have, reading the "Lutheran Hour Ministries" I receive daily in my internet mail.

There are many false prophets out there today, aren't there? I can name a few and some sound like they are truly speaking from the mouth of God. But are they? Or are they using God for their own purposes to enrich People like Kenneth themselves? Copeland, Joel Osteen, Jimmy Bakker and many, many others. Is there anything wrong with being a televangelist to spread the Word of God? No. But what are the priorities for spreading it? Is it self-enrichment, or is it to help everyone hear the Word?

Joel Osteen is worth between \$40 and \$100 million; he lives in a \$10.5M home, 17,000 square feet. Is he using God's Word to enrich himself with his extravagant lifestyle while his followers can only dream of such wealth? He was criticized for welcoming hurricane evacuees into his Lakewood megachurch. He blamed it on flooding which locals said was false. Roads were open. Does this sound like someone you would want to follow to hear God's Word?

Jimmy Bakker was sentenced to five years in prison for stealing money from his followers. Was he preaching God's Word to enrich himself?

Kenneth Copeland's net worth is between \$450 and \$700 million. Claims his 3 jets are needed to spread God's Word. He asked his followers to donate to upgrade the runways for his jets.

The bottom line is "What are these guys really doing and what is the purpose for doing it?" They are persuasive talkers and people listen. Why? Because they want to hear the Word of God. But do these televangelists truly have God in their hearts, or is it just a money-making ploy?

Be wary of these types of "false?" prophets! I will not argue with you if you think they truly are prophets of God. I don't! If they truly are, "Why aren't they spreading that wealth back to their followers to help them in their struggles rather than living in mansions and amassing such wealth? Think about it; between them, they could give every single person in this country a million dollars and it wouldn't put a dent in their lifestyles. Or imagine how much they could share with churches to help them spread the Word of God to more people. Better yet, all the followers that contribute to these guys could give those donations to their own churches, rather than contributing to someone's extravagant lifestyle while hearing the Word of God.

Beware of false prophets. Come to church and support it for the benefit of the congregation, and you. Hear God's Word in our church and give generously to support its mission. It's about priorities. It's about living a life with Jesus and giving what you can. Following Christ, not false prophets, is the only way to Everlasting Life.


