## The Journey

We come off the Transfiguration mount with Peter, James, and John into the valley. After the shining Jesus, Moses, Elijah, the cloud, and the Father's voice this may seem anticlimactic. But it reminds us that the true glory isn't the glory of this world nor is the mission of the Christ to impress sinners. The true mission of the Christ is to travel on to the cross and die for the sins of the world. There Jesus would be transfigured into our sin. He takes every last sin of all sinners on Himself and pays the price before the Father for us. This is where we are traveling during Lent- to the tree with Jesus.

We know exactly where we are going, so why bother? We travel this road every year in our church calendar. Isn't it just the same journey that we make every year, so why bother? We travel this road with Jesus each year because it matters. It is important to remember what Jesus has done for us, lest we forget or think it unimportant. We renew our zeal, refocus our attention on Jesus, and travel through Lent into Holy Week. It is important that we focus on what Jesus has done for us.

Jesus set His face to go to Jerusalem and die. He willingly rode into the city on Palm Sunday. The pilgrim throngs exalting Him the Son of David, the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Jesus taught in the Temple for much of that week. On Thursday He celebrated the Passover with His disciples giving them His body and blood, "Take, eat this is my body... Take drink this is my blood." That night they went out to the Mount of Olives to pray. Jesus prayed and sweat those drops of blood. He knew what was coming.

One of the disciples came to arrest Jesus. Judas betrayed Jesus with a kiss and the disciples fled. Jesus was on trial with Pilate, and Herod, and Pilate again. "Behold the man!" Jesus was beaten, whipped, crowned with thorns. The Jews cried out that they wanted Jesus crucified, "Crucify Him! Let His blood be on us and on our children!" And His blood was on them.

Jesus was crucified. Zealous that the crucified should die, the Romans broke the legs of the two others crucified with Jesus, but when they came to Jesus He was already dead. That soldier thrust the spear into Jesus' side. And at once blood and water came forth. Behold the dead God!

Jesus was taken off the cross and placed in that new garden tomb. He completed the true Sabbath rest on Saturday. He rose Sunday descending into hell to proclaim victory. He was there in the garden with Mary. He was in that locked upper room with the timid disciples and then on the Emmaus road. Jesus appeared to the disciples and many others over the next weeks. Forty days after Easter Jesus ascended bodily into heaven. And ten days after that the Spirit rushed in on the disciples.

But why? Why did God's Son have to come in the flesh? He came in the flesh to offer that flesh on the cross for sinners. Why did Jesus have to die? He came to die for you. This is why it is valuable for you to travel through the events of Lent and Holy Week for this was done for you. Jesus was thinking of you while giving the Supper to the disciples, while being arrested and on trial, while being beaten, and while dying on the tree. This is for you. Not that it *was* for you, but it *is* for you. It is for you now, right now. In the Divine Service you receive what Jesus did for you. He comes to you again and again giving you what you need- the forgiveness of your sins.

So travel this road during Lent. Remember your sins and mortality. Know your inability to keep the law and turn to the tree. The one hanging there pours out water and blood for you. That water of your Baptism and that body and blood in the Supper which Jesus gives to you. He connects you to Himself through these means. Travel this Lenten road with your brothers and sisters in Christ. Come and hear what Jesus has done for you. Receive what Jesus has done for you. Give thanks for all that Jesus has done for you.

## **Voters' Meeting** **February 1, 2026**

*66 voting members were present.*

**Elders:** Transfers in – Cammie and Sylar Coffindaffer. The meeting with the Elders last Sunday had good discussion. There has been an increase in Pastors' mileage from 70 to 72.5 cents per mile. Elders are reviewing the inactive list (anyone that hasn't communed in the last 2 years.) Discussion was had on cancelling church services during bad weather; we will plan to remain open for those who wish to come. A group met with Officer Gokey to discuss church and school safety.

**Trustees:** We are looking into a new company to check out the bell

tower, if anyone has any ideas let Joel know. The new heating system for the church is on schedule for this summer. Trustees are working on some electrical projects in the church. There is some stonework being done in the youth room.

**Stewardship:** The cookbook has enough recipes! The Red Letter Challenge books are in, a few extras are available for anyone wanting to join. Julie Burgess will be coming to discuss financial planning and giving, a tentative date of June 7 is being planned. We are planning a taco bar for the meager meal on February 25. The Stewardship Board has a few vacancies; we invite you to join!

**Evangelism:** The Christmas Concert was well attended. Evangelism will be providing refreshments for the Lutheran Hour Rally livestream today at 2pm.

**Youth:** On December 17, 12 kids enjoyed the Collide Christmas Party with cookies, a dice game and gifts of socks and candy. January 11 was the Jimmy Jam semi-formal dance; 70 kids were in attendance, \$550 was raised for Mott Children's Hospital. Ash Wednesday Collide will be serving 3 soups for the meager meal. June 28-July 3 will be the LCMS Michigan District High School Gathering in Mackinac. Informational meeting coming soon. Today is Sherwood on the Hill sledding for all ages from 2-4pm.

**School Board:** This past week was National Lutheran Schools week. The kids enjoyed a variety of events. Our school is active with a variety of clubs, sports, Junior National Honor Society, Honor roll breakfast, etc. The credit card machine is fully operational for tuition and hot lunch payments. Tammy Lutz is the new (LEAP) Lutheran Education Advancement Plan person. They host 10 meetings a year. BOE met with Officer Gokey and church leaders to put together a plan bridging school and church safety. We will be first addressing doors and the locking system at CTK. We have received

CMIF (Commissioned Minister Information Forms) and are in the beginning stages of looking at what is needed next year in regards to teaching staff, enrollment, tuition costs and budget. We updates our hourly wage employees to comply with the recent increase of minimum wage to \$13.73/hour.

**Principal's Report:** In November the kids participated in a "Pick a Date" Challenge. 23 kids raised \$7,000 to apply money directly to their tuition. In December we hosted the Holly Jolly Fair; 51 students took part. \$860 was raised for seed money for the next year and to support the clubs offered at CTK. In January we hosted Lutheran Schools Week; the service project was making senior kits filled with everyday items. February 5 is the all school spelling bee. First grade will be making and selling apple pies again this year for the super bowl. February 6-7 Mrs. Yoder will be at a principals conference. March 18 will be the Academic Fair at CTK. A rummage sale is planned for March 20-21; donations will be accepted March 9-16. All monies will go to the scholarship fund.

**Athletics:** Soccer/Volleyball coaches are secured for this year, soccer officials too. B Basketball has wrapped up, A girls basketball had their 8<sup>th</sup> grade parent night. We are waiting for reimbursement from Frankenmuth Credit Union for the new scoreboard. Our current balance is \$8,328.25. A track coach for this spring is still needed.

**Unfinished Business:** Council has made the recommendation that we move from 5 Voter meetings per year to 3 meetings. A vote was taken by ballot and passed with a 2/3 majority. Council also recommended that we move the Voters meetings from Monday nights to Sunday after church. A voice vote passed the motion.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor wanted to thank everyone who came to the meeting and invites everyone back

every Sunday for Bible Study! On March 29 the Bethlehem Crafters will have items available for purchase in the Great Room. August 2 will be Church Extension Fund Sunday. Confirmation will be May 3 and May 10 this year. Pastor Garrison will be retiring May 2027.
