G.L.U.E **“God Loves Us** **Eternally”**

Isaiah 60:1

Arise, shine for your light has come and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you.

January 6th is the day we celebrated Epiphany, which celebrates the coming of Christ and His divine nature, particularly from the visit by the Maji (Wise Men). It's God bringing His Son to be the Savior of all people, including us, the Gentiles.

Epiphany is more than a day, it's a season, continuing until the beginning of Lent. It's God's introduction of His Son to the world, the beginning of Jesus' presence, as a human being among the people. When Jesus was baptized, the Holy Spirit descended upon Him. He would go on to preach the Word of God and perform miracles.

The last event of the Epiphany Season is the Transfiguration of our Lord. Epiphany reveals the reason Jesus came to us as one of us. It fulfills God's promise of a messiah to save all people, to die for us, forgiving us all our sins. To be raised from the dead, ascend into Heaven with the promise that if we believe in Him we, too, will have everlasting life!

Here is an epiphanized list to consider (Lutheran Witness, January 1, 2007, "The Splendor of Epiphany.")

1. Share the splendor of Epiphany as God did by the guiding star and worship Jesus with precious gifts.
2. Draw on your baptism for comfort, confidence and courage.
3. Use your newness of life to care for others.
4. Let the words of your mouth and the meditation of your heart be acceptable to the Lord.

5. Live a life of love described by St. Paul.
6. Excel in building up the church.
7. Strive to live the "blessed" life outlined by Jesus.
8. Remember that Jesus is God's Son and Chosen One.
9. Listen to Him.

Epiphany, the season that shows us that God Loves Us Eternally!

Council Meeting **January 12**

Elders: There is a change in the wording of the wedding contracts to include organist or recorded music for \$150. Elders will be reviewing the inactive members list in February. Update on the 175th Anniversary planning – "God is with us forever" is our theme. Discussion was had on a youth led service, possible t-shirts/sweatshirts, a reception, etc. Please share any recommendations or ideas with Barbara Bleck. Officer Gokey will be coming to do an updated safety review of the church and school on January 26. We have a quote for the automatic door; we plan to wait for the safety walk through to make decisions on this. Elders have increased Pastors' mileage from 70 to 72.5 cents per mile.

Trustees: Nothing new to report.

Stewardship: 300 recipes have been submitted for the cookbook, we can still add more. The last date to have recipes included is February 22. Stewardship is reaching out to Julie Burgess to come talk to the congregation about including the church in estate planning. Red Letter Challenge books for over Lent will be pre-pay. Those purchasing before January 19 will receive a \$5 discount. Books purchased after this date will be \$20. The Stewardship meager meal will be tacos served on February 25!

Evangelism: No report given.

Youth: On December 21 Collide's Jr High group had their Christmas party with 14 in attendance. The Jimmy Jam semi-formal dance was held this weekend

with about 70 kids in attendance, everything went smoothly! February 18 Collide will host a soup supper meager meal with chicken noodle, chili and potato soups available. Sunday, February 21 there will be an information meeting for any student (current grades 8-12) wishing to attend the conference this year on Mackinac Island. The conference is June 28-July 1. A large private donation was received by Collide, it will be used to complete the masonry work in the youth room.

School Board: Credit Card processing is up and running for use at the school including taking tuition payments. It is not available to use when buying scrip. Over the next two months the school board will be reviewing staffing needs and tuition. We have located the 2020 safety review, this will be handy when we meet with Officer Gokey. Planning for Musicfest is on track.

Principal's Report: The A girls basketball season has begun. Lutheran Schools Week is January 23-February 1. The Holly Jolly Fair was well attended, plans are already being made for next year. CTK will host a rummage sale this spring.

President's Report: At the next Voters meeting we will be voting on the constitution change to lower the number of meetings per year.

Vice President's Report: A reminder that it's the time of year to be working on budgets and ballots.

Pastor's Report: February 1 is the Lutheran Hour Rally at 2pm. We will be livestreaming it in the Great Room. Lent begins February 18 with Ash Wednesday – we will be covering the Parables of Jesus. We will have visitors from Bethlehem with their handmade crafts on March 29. August 2 will be CEF Sunday.

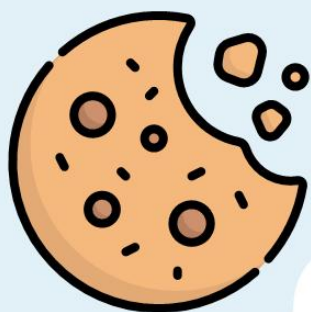
