Just Dust

"Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." Is that it? There's nothing more? The curse given to Adam and Eve in the garden is repeated to us on Ash Wednesday. We trace that ashen cross on our forehead with those words from Genesis 3.19. Their sin plunged all creation into sin and meant their physical deaths. The wages of sin is death, and they died.

They were reminded of this promise with every sickness, hurt and grief. They knew that creation was no longer perfect. They sinned. They were just dust. God was serious about their sin and the curse He imposed upon them. No amount of hiding, groveling or blaming could remove this curse from them. They were just dust.

The curse of sin continued through the successive generations. Sinners were born to sinners. Sin was inherited from parents to children. They were just dust. I that it? Nothing more? For the wicked angels this was it. They sinned and were cursed. No hope. But for mankind more was given than the curse.

God promised to come. He would redeem sinners by striking the head of the evil one. He would rescue sinners and give them new life. That promise was passed down through successive generations. Faithful parents taught their children about how God would redeem sinners. It was their hope and desire.

Into dust God was born. God took on flesh for sinners. He lived among sinners and suffered their ridicule and unbelief. He worked miracles, but they refused to see. He spoke parables, but they refused to understand. He forgave sins, but they refused to believe. Sinners knew that He was just dust. He could be killed, even crucified. They cried out for His death, "Crucify Him!"

God came and died. Here was the plan even before Adam and Eve sinned in the garden. God knew they would sin and He knew He would come to seek and save the lost. He was raised from the dust of death on the third day as proof that your sins are forgiven. Do you see His miracles? Do you understand His parables? Do you believe in the forgiveness of your sins?

This is what Lent is all about. It is about who we are and what God has done for us. We are sinners through and through. We sin in thought, word and deed. We sin against God and man. God knows all our sins and gives us the law that we would know also. Examine yourself in light of His law and see your sins. You cannot save yourself. This is what Lent is about.

God saves you. He enters your frail humanity and dies in your place. He takes all your sins on Himself; suffering and dying in your stead. He gives you the benefits of His death through the Sacraments; those things which He began to tie you to Himself. Through Baptism and the Supper you are joined to Jesus and forgiven. By His Word you are made clean. This is what Lent is all about.

You receive more than the ashen cross on your forehead. You receive more than law and condemnation. You receive Jesus- just Jesus. He rescues you from the dust of death. You are more than dust, more than death. You are His own dear child. You are precious in His sight. So come and receive Jesus with us this Lent at Immanuel.

[16] "And when you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. [17] But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, [18] that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you."

Note: Make sure that fasting is done to God's glory, not like hypocrites. (Lutheran Study Bible, pg.1590)

Well, it's sports time again isn't it, even though I'm beyond my "March plaving davs. Madness"...when college basketball takes precedence over all other sports. Many of us look forward to watching our favorite teams as they compete for the college championship trophies. The big one, of course, is the NCAA championship.

However, for Christians, an even BIGGER event beginning in Lent...the early March is penitential season in preparation for the observance of Easter. It is Christian's of the time atonement—reconciliation with God through repentance and confession of their sins. Wednesday is March 5th...the beginning of our repentance lasting 40 days for fasting and praying in relationship to Jesus' spending 40 days in the wilderness without water and food and being tempted by Satan. Lent leads up to Holy Week (April 13th). Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday and is the final leg of Jesus' journey to the Cross, being nailed mercilessly by His hands and feet on Good Friday, forgiving us our sins and saving us from eternal damnation! SYMBOLS

As previously stated our chancel is the vocal point of our church for several reasons. Our sermons are preached at the pulpit; our epistle, Old Testament and gospel are read at the lectern; baptisms are done at the font; and the Lord's Supper is received at the communion rail.

A reredos is located behind the altar. It can be made of wood, stone, ivory, metal or any combination. The reredos function is to draw the attention to the altar. In our church, the reredos is wood with carved grapes and wheat across the top and side panels. The grapes symbolize the wine, Jesus blood, and the what, Jesus' body. Next to the reredos are two candelabras which symbolize that Jesus is the light of the world (John 8:12 & John 1:6-18). The candles consuming themselves shows how Jesus spent himself serving mankind. The altar represents where Jesus sacrificed himself (Hebrews 10:10-14). Our altar is where the bread and wine and two communion candlesticks placed.

Another symbol of where our sins are washed away and forgive in the baptismal font located at the front of the chancel floor. Jesus willingly died on the cross to defeat sin, death and the devil. A single candle called the Christ candle or Paschal candle, is a symbol of Christ's resurrection. It is lit from Easter Sunday to Ascension Day. A processional cross is used to both start and conclude a service. The lectern where the epistle, Old Testament and gospels are read at each service shows grapes and wheat, also a crown and cross symbolizing Jesus who died on the cross to rid the world of sin, death and the devil.
