What shall we say then? Are we to continue in
sin that grace may abound? ²By no means! How
can we who died to sin still live in it? ³Do you

into Christ Jesus were baptized into his

death? ⁴We were buried therefore with him by
baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ
was raised from the dead by the glory of the
Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

⁵For if we have been united with him in a
death like his, we shall certainly be united with
him in a resurrection like his. ⁶We know that our
old self was crucified with him in order that the
body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that
we would no longer be enslaved to sin. ⁷For one
who has died has been set free from sin. ⁸Now
if we have died with Christ, we believe that we
will also live with him. ⁹We know that Christ
being raised from the dead will never die again;
death no longer has dominion over him. ¹⁰For
the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but
the life he lives he lives to God. ¹¹So you also
must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive
to God in Christ Jesus.

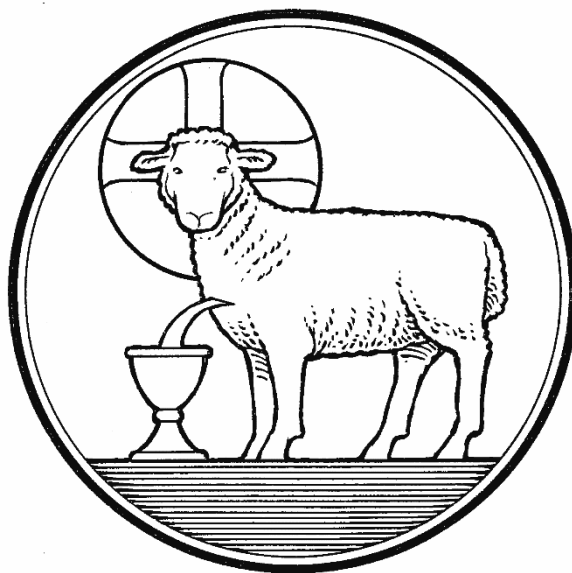

Office of the Keys

What is the Office of the Keys?

The Office of the Keys is that special authority which Christ has given to His Church on earth to forgive the sins of repentant sinners, but to withhold forgiveness from the unrepentant as long as they do not repent.

Where is this written?

This is what St. John the Evangelist writes in chapter twenty: The Lord Jesus breathed on His disciples and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven." (John 20:22-23)

What do you believe according to these words?

I believe that when the called ministers of Christ deal with us by His divine command, in particular when they exclude openly unrepentant sinners from the Christian congregation and absolve those who repent of their sins and want to do better, this is just as valid and certain, even in heaven, as if Christ our dear Lord dealt with us Himself.
