Reminder

Paul writes to the Corinthians about the hope he has in Christ. The Corinthians needed the reminder. They had more than a few troubles in their congregation. The reminder that Paul gave showed that amid their sin there was hope in Christ. Paul had been among them and proclaimed the Word of God to them. They needed just Jesus.

Could they remember his sermons? Were they able to think back to Paul's teaching on Scripture? They had been there. They had heard him. They had received the Word. They needed a reminder. Paul writes:

Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain.

For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God (1 Corinthians 15.1-9).

Paul gives them proof. This Jesus theology is not just his, it came from the Scriptures. Further, it was not just Paul who had seen the risen Christ. Peter, five hundred, and James all had. Of course, they knew Peter, the bold and brash disciple of Jesus. And who in the first century didn't know the leader of the church in Jerusalem, James. The resurrection was attested to by many prominent people in their midst.

Further proof is in the person of Paul. The Corinthians knew that Paul had persecuted the church when he was called Saul. Saul had traveled zealously to arrest and persecute followers of the Way. He was stopped short on the road to Damascus by Jesus. This began the conversion of Saul into Paul. Paul had suffered much for the Name of Jesus. The Corinthians could simply look to Paul's life as a reminder of all that Jesus meant.

Paul reminded the Corinthians of the Gospel that they heard, in which they stood, and by which they were saved that they would hold fast to the Word. This was Paul's fervent desire and hope. But not just Paul's. It is our hope also. Still today it is the hope of fathers and mothers that their children would grow up in Christ and live as Christians. It is hope of spouses that their partner would be in Christ. It is the desire of neighbors that their friends would be found in Christ eternally. We know what Paul was hoping- that his friends would remain faithful unto the end.

So we live lives as Christians. We love those around us and receive Christ in the Divine Service. For our own sakes, for we know our sins and they are ever before us. But also to give our loved ones an example. To show others that this is what a Christian does. That they would follow our example and join us in worship. That they too would live like Christians and turn others to see the mercy of God in Christ Jesus. This was what Paul deeply wanted for the Corinthians.

Of course, the world, our sinful nature, and the evil one would not have us live as Christians. We are tempted to be away from worship. We are tempted to think that God does not care about this sin or that. We are tempted to assume we really don't need Jesus. We are tempted with the easy road, to just live like the world and conform to the world's desires. It takes effort to live differently.

Thus, we live differently. We join together to receive Jesus in Word and Sacrament. We pray for one another. We support each other. We love our neighbor in his or her need. We rejoice together. For all this what do we hope to get? Just Jesus and to be in Jesus. That is all we need as Christians. It is all Paul wanted for the Corinthians.

“Father, forgive them!”

Try to imagine for a moment living in the days of Jesus. People all around you yelling for your crucifixion. Others mocking you and saying, “If you are the King, come down and save yourself!” All the while laughing in anticipation of watching you die with your hands and feet nailed to the cross, blood running down your body, a crown of thorns piercing your skull and blood flowing in your face. What would you be thinking right about now? Would you be praying, crying out for help?

Also, a couple of strangers being hung on crosses along with you. One of them yelling at you to save yourself and them. Only thinking of himself, not really caring if you save the other guy. And the other one, knowing who you are, knowing you have done nothing wrong, having lived a perfect life, says to the other guy, “Do you know who you are talking to? This man has done nothing wrong. We deserve this punishment for what we have done. Then he says to you, “Remember me when you come into your kingdom!” Begging you to take him with you.

Here you are hanging on the cross. What would you do? Would you be begging to be let down from the cross? Would you be begging to be relieved of this pain and suffering? Probably exactly what you would do.

And yet, Jesus said, “Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do!” Three words, “Father forgive them!” He asks forgiveness for you, even though you have hung Him on this cross to die, mocking Him, laughing at Him, tearing away His garments and casting lots for them. He died. He died for you! He died so that you may live! He did not cry out for Himself! He cried out for YOU! “Father, forgive them!” Jesus was looking out for you, not Himself, you, so that you can spend the rest of your life, after your days here on earth, with Him in Heaven.

What a glorious day on Easter Sunday when Jesus rises so that we could be with Him all the rest of the days of our lives.

“Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.” (LSB, #767)

Sing it, “Je-sus, re-mem-ber me when You come in-to Your kingdom.

“Thank the Lord, for He is good, and His mercy endures forever!” Amen.

How You Can Be a “Marketplace missionary” At Work!

The Great Commission calls us to go into all the world with the Gospel of Jesus. A Marketplace Missionary is a Christian who gives witness to Jesus in all areas of their lives that make contact with other people. One important mission field is at your place of

employment. You are around your fellow co-workers all day and have already developed personal relationships with them which can lead to opportunities to share your Christian faith. Here are eight ways you can represent Jesus at work:

1. Don't Complain. Some people at your work probably make a habit of complaining about everything and everyone. Stand out by resisting the impulse to complain and instead, put the best construction on everything. If your co-workers see that you are a Christian, then they might be more open to hearing about Jesus.

2. Be Honest. Integrity is very important, since you represent Jesus to your co-workers.

3. Do Your Work With Excellence. Your hard work and preparation go hand-in-hand with being a follower of Jesus. Other people will notice when your hard work gives glory to God.

4. Watch Your Language. Nothing hurts more than other people seeing a follower of Jesus using ugly and foul language. Use your words wisely and carefully so that God is honored with your behavior.

5. Encourage Others. Helping your fellow co-workers in words and actions demonstrates God's love and compassion. Even bosses need to hear words of encouragement from their employees.

6. Walk Away From Gossip. Be aware of your environment and avoid those situations where one is tempted to join in on the "office gossip". Defend someone's reputation when other try to tear them down.

7. Serve Others. Your co-workers will be more open to hear about Jesus when they experience your unselfish service to them in both small and large situations.

8. Pray For Your Co-Workers. Be sensitive and aware of

the various needs of your co-workers. Pray for them throughout the work day. If possible, let them know that you would be willing to pray for and with them. Most co-workers would probably appreciate another person's prayers on their behalf.

There will be time when we fail at representing Jesus at our place of employment. When those times arise, we need to confess our failings to God, receive forgiveness and ask the Holy Spirit for renewed wisdom and strength to go back out into the world as ambassadors for Jesus. May God bless your ministry as a "marketplace missionary" in your job and place of employment.

SYMBOLS

Many symbols in the chancel have been highlighted. Moving from the chancel and traversing to the nave floor three steps separate the two levels. These steps are one example of many architectural symbols in our church building. Three steps, three persons in the Holy Trinity, Father, Son & Holy Ghost.

On the nave floor to right and left the two cruciform extensions are called transepts. Another architectural symbol. Each of the two transepts have three stained glass windows highlighting Jesus and the four evangelists. The north transept center window is Jesus standing at the latch-less door knocking, waiting for us to open our hearts and let him in. On each side of Jesus are two of the four evangelists, Matthew to the left of Jesus and Mark to the right. Matthew is a winged man stressing the human nature of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. Mark, a winged

lion, shows the power and activity of strong deeds.

Looking to the left are three windows in the south transept. Jesus in the center, as in the north transept windows. The evangelist Luke is a winged ox. The oxen were sacrificial animals. Jesus died on the cross to save us from our sins. Jesus is standing with two children. He is a leader. Children should be led and nurtured. The fourth, and last, evangelist is John who is shown as a winged eagle. Eagles can fly very high. In our window John depicts Jesus like an eagle soaring on eagles' wings to the highest, Heaven.
