Death to Life

The hand of the LORD was upon me, and he brought me out in the Spirit of the LORD and set me down in the middle of the valley; it was full of bones. And he led me around among them, and behold, there were very many on the surface of the valley, and behold, they were very dry. And he said to me, “Son of man, can these bones live?” And I answered, “O Lord GOD, you know.” – Ezekiel 37.1-3

Ezekiel is taken, by the Lord, to a valley of death. Dry bones everywhere. What must have Ezekiel been thinking? Maybe he was wondering if some great battle had taken place or if some pestilence had claimed the lives of so many. Such assumptions would have proved wrong. This valley of death was the people that Ezekiel knew. They were alive in body, but dead spiritually before God.

What a rude awakening! God, calling His own people dead! But they were dead. Ezekiel must have known it by now though. God had allowed a foreign nation, Babylon, to conquer Judah and Israel had fallen already. Ezekiel had been trying to call the people of God back to be faithful again, but none seemed to listen. They were dead in their sins.

They had no time for God. Their lives were simply too busy. Work, family, entertainment took up too much of their day. Who could spare a moment to think about the mercy God gave or pray to Him? They ignored God and His warnings.

Would God's people listen now? Now that they had been conquered by Babylon and their homes destroyed. Would they desire to be faithful once more? Would God even accept them back?

There was hope. Ezekiel is told that God would raise His people from their graves and God would bring them back to their land. God would have mercy again. He would forgive His people.

Ezekiel's vision is a reminder to the church, in every age, to be faithful. It is easy to become too busy for God. How quickly can one get out of the habit of going to church, or praying, or studying the Word? How the devil would love to entice you to make a thousand excuses for why you can't be around your Father's house. How your sinful nature would love to be doing anything else but being about what your Savior would have you do.

For the people of Judah in Ezekiel's day, their turning from God came slowly. But God noticed. He knew their excuses and the sins of their hearts. He knew they fell into temptation. God knew and still had mercy. He called His people back from sin. He allowed them to travel back from captivity in Babylon and rebuild their city and the temple. He forgave.

So learn from the people of Judah. Be in worship. Be alive in Christ, not dead in sin. Find His grace for you continually in the Divine Service. Let no excuse, no activity, nothing else remove you from Him. Jesus has died for you and desires to give you the benefits of His death. So come, receive, and live.

G.L.U.E **“God Loves Us Eternally”**

2 Corinthians 13:14

[14] The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all. (ESV)

During June and July each year is the celebration of the Sundays following Pentecost, the period known as “The Time of the Church,” the final period in the church year known as “The Season of The Holy Trinity.” Trinity Sunday (May 26th), remember that day? That’s the only Sunday of the year that we get to recite “The Athanasian Creed.” We always look forward to reciting the longest creed, don’t we? And it is a whopper—repetitive, long, intricate and so confusing, isn’t it? But, what it does is confess our belief in the Trinity, “the three Persons of the Trinity. God is One, but also Three: The Father, Son and Holy Spirit.”*

The Season of the Holy Trinity lasts until September 22nd. The 1st Sunday after Trinity is June 2nd this year. The suggested verses for the First Reading is Genesis 15:1-6. The Psalm verses are Psalm 33:12-22. The Epistle is 1 John 4:16-21 and the Gospel is Luke 16:19-31. I encourage you to read the passages designated for each Sunday throughout the Trinity season. The readings can be found at

Understanding that the Trinity is Three Persons in One is difficult. At least it was for me. How can there be three persons in one? But, “the Father and the Son are not related in a biological way.

Before the beginning of time there was the Father and the Son, together one God, yet in a relationship to one another like that of Father and Son. And the Holy Spirit “proceeds” from the Father and the Son.”*

The Athanasian Creed, Apostle’s Creed and the Nicene Creed all affirm the relationship between each of the Three Persons of the Holy Trinity. This is what we believe. Scripture testifies to this “inner relationship.”

Like the Athanasian Creed, my article is long this month. Sorry for that, but it took as much explaining as the “Creed” itself. (Smile). God’s blessings to all!

The Board of Education is excited to share some new, positive changes coming this fall to strengthen the education received at CTK. It is the goal of those in leadership at Christ the King to offer a Christ centered, quality education to our children and to serve our families well and these are believed to be the best options for our beloved school. Below is a summary of current changes.

Principal Position - Mrs. Jenifer Yoder, CTK's 4th grade teacher, will be the Interim Principal for the 2024-2025 school year. She will handle administrative duties for half the day and teach 4th grade the other half of the day. Mrs. Stephanie Boyer will handle the remaining 4th grade teaching responsibilities.

Middle School Teacher - Mr. John Markiewicz will teach middle school. Mr. Markiewicz is a December graduate of Concordia University and will soon be married to our 5th grade teacher, Miss Hannah Volz.

Preschool is Growing! - Preschool enrollment continues to climb and currently has over 30 students registered for the fall. Due to this growth and some smaller class sizes, Kindergarten and first grade will move to the Sebewaing campus. This allows CTK to have one central campus for all of our K-8 students and to better utilize faculty, staff, materials and space while allowing the preschool an opportunity to grow even more at the Unionville campus.

Opportunities for grades one and two - As part of the continuing efforts to provide an excellent education and to meet our students' academic, spiritual, social, physical, and emotional needs, CTK will adopt a multi-grade classroom configuration for grades one and two for the 2024-2025 school year. This multi-grade classroom will be taught by Ms. Cindy Engelhard as the lead teacher with the addition of an assistant.

As we end one school year and prepare for the next, there are many moving parts and much to be fleshed out. We pray that these changes will prove to be a great blessing to Christ the King and ultimately to all of you as well and we ask that you keep the faculty,

staff, and Board of Education in your prayers.

Lastly, on a personal note I'd like to thank you all for the time I've spent here as principal of Christ the King. I pray God's continued blessings on all of you and will continue to keep you in my prayers.
