Learn from the Master

Now when the Pharisees gathered to him, with some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem, they saw that some of his disciples ate with hands that were defiled, that is, unwashed. – Mark 7.1-2

Jesus gives the Pharisees and Scribes a lesson in the law. The Pharisees thought that the law was only about what they were to avoid doing. They knew all the "don'ts" of the commandments. They even made laws around the law of God to avoid breaking God's law. They knew that they had to be careful, after all, God had destroyed Judah in the past for disobeying His law.

This careful attitude led the Pharisees to be very zealous for the law. So when they saw the disciples of Jesus eating with ceremonial unclean hands, they took offense. The disciples' hands were clean enough to eat, but now washed in the ceremonial way. God had directed that the priests who served in the Temple were to ceremonial wash their hands before service. The Pharisees took this regulation and brought it home to everyone. Everyone should wash their hands in a ceremonial way before eating (not just priests who were serving in the Temple).

This was the sort of thing the Pharisees enjoyed. After all, it was easy to wash hands before a meal. They could make a show of it, pouring water on their hands, so all around would see how clean they were. And, of course, anyone who did not do as they did, was subjected to their scorn.

But this is not how the law is meant to be used. The law is not just a curb to direct our behavior. It is not just a bunch of "don'ts." But the law's primary use is a mirror- to reflect our sins back to us. The law should show us how sinful we are. But the Pharisees did not want to see that! They did not want to talk about their sins, only how good they were. It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick.

The mirror of the law should show us how sick we are with sin. There is nothing we can do about it either! We can't wash sin off, like washing our hands. Nor can we just wish it away. We can't hide behind what we might call good deeds either. For God knows all things and demands that we be holy as He is holy. The way to eternal life is perfection; narrow, indeed!

This is Jesus' point with the Pharisees. Not about whether His disciples follow the rules of elders, but the Pharisees view of the law. They don't understand what they are so zealous about. They do not use the law to reflect their sins back to themselves, but rather use the law as an excuse for sin.

The Pharisees are happy to ignore the commandments of God when they conflict with their own laws. They are happy not to help their neighbor should it conflict with their idea of cleanliness (think the parable of the good Samaritan). And they are happy to ignore any sins they commit. They don't know their deep need for a Savior for they do not know how sinful they are.

So you know. Realize how sinful you are. Don't brush your sins away but use the law as Jesus directs. Reflect all your sins back to you. All the sinful through, words, desires, actions. And what can you give to God for them? What could you offer that would take care of all your sins? What does God need from a sinner?

There is only one thing God wants from sinners. Sin. God desires to take all your sins from you and pay the price for them on the tree. This is what Jesus offers the Pharisees. He shows them their sins that they would realize who they are and their need for a Savior. Jesus travels on to the tree for sinners. He suffers and gives His life for those who sin against God and man. For the worst offender Jesus dies; even for you.

The only answer to the severe demands of the law is what Jesus has done for us. He does all the work, and we do nothing. So come to where Jesus is found for you. He is found in the Divine Service; serving you with Himself. He speaks you clean in the absolution. He washes you through Baptism, bringing that grace to you again and again. He feeds you with His body and blood. These gifts are for sinners who know their need. So come, sinner, and receive Jesus. In the Name of Jesus, Pastor Boyer

My prayers are simple, humble and earnest and I know that God is listening. He is listening to yours, also!

When we seek the Lord in humble and earnest prayer, His listening shows us that "God Loves Us Eternally!"
