Like a Lamb

The LORD made it known to me and I knew; then you showed me their deeds. But I was like a gentle lamb led to the slaughter. I did not know it was against me they devised schemes, saying, "Let us destroy the tree with its fruit, let us cut him off from the land of the living, that his name be remembered no more." But, O LORD of hosts, who judges righteously, who tests the heart and the mind, let me see your vengeance upon them, for to you have I committed my cause. – Jeremiah 23.18-20

Jeremiah was led like a lamb. He is talking about himself here. He had gone to the people of God in Judah and told them all that God had made known to him. God was displeased with their worship of false gods and God was calling His people back. Repent and come back to the true God! The God who worked the plagues on Egypt and gave the Israelites the promised land wanted His people back.

But while Jeremiah was speaking GOD's Word, the people laid schemes against him. He had no idea what they planned to do to him. The wicked people wanted to cut him off from the land of the living. They did not want to hear God's message nor see His prophet. They wanted Jeremiah's name remembered no more.

Jeremiah was led like a lamb to the slaughter. He was only trying to do the work of God, showing God's people their sin. But he was rejected and led out to die. They would throw Jeremiah down a cistern and he would sink into the mud. No doubt he expected he would die down there.

Of course, these words of Jeremiah are connected to another. There was another led like a lamb to the slaughter. Isaiah records of a suffering servant that, "He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he opened not his mouth". (Isaiah 53.7)

The suffering servant would go like a lamb to the slaughter. Although, unlike Jeremiah, He would know exactly what the people were plotting. He knew the evil in their hearts as they cried out that He should be crucified. Jesus had proclaimed the Word of God to sinners, but they did not want to hear. They wanted Him to die.

Jeremiah did not die in that cistern. He was pulled out by the Babylonians after they destroyed Jerusalem. The people of God did realize their sin and repent. God allowed them to return to Jerusalem and rebuild. They would be a more faithful people. Jesus did die on that tree. He was led to the slaughter by sinners and gave His life. But His death was not in vain.

As the Lamb of God dies on the tree He took the sins of all sinners on Himself. He was cut off from the land of the living. He suffered and died for the worst offenders. He died for you that you would not die in sin but live eternally. God has mercy on sinners. In the time of Jeremiah mercy was offered and it still is offered.

Jesus stands ready to forgive your sins. He offers you Himself through Word and Sacrament. He desires to have a relationship with you and hear you as you pray to Him. Understand that He was led like a lamb to the slaughter for you. Know that He died in your place. He suffered your punishment under the law. He did all this out of love for you. So now receive Him as He comes to you in the Divine Service. He is here for you.

What a wonderful harvest it will be when Jesus comes again and takes us all to His "barn" in heaven to share in the harvest of eternal life. Thanks be to God for our harvest here on earth and the ultimate

harvest when we go to live with Him in the "Big Barn" of Heaven!

Heavenly Father, we thank You for our harvest here on earth and we thank You for harvesting us from our sin through Jesus' dying on the Cross. Amen.

When Jesus comes again the final harvest will continue to show us that "God Loves Us Eternally!"

Voters' Meeting September 16

Trustees: The Bell Tower will be evaluated with plans for repairs over the next couple months. The wooden church doors have been refinished. New concrete has been laid out to the flagpole in front of the school. New floors and paint have updated a number of rooms in the school. Grant money will be used for new bleachers and possibly a new sound system. The parsonage garage roof needs to be repaired/replaced. The Dusty Club Annual Golf Outing funds will be

used toward a new heating system for the church.

Evangelism: A Prayer Vigil will take place on Saturday, September 28 from 9am-9pm. December 1 Justified Quartet will be having a concert at Immanuel. A love offering will be collected and refreshments provided.

Youth: Collide hosted a face painting and glow stick table at USA Homecoming. Monday, September 23 will be Oktoberfest due to volleyball and soccer games being at home that day. A Pumpkin Roll is planned for mid-October. A Glow Maze evening is being planned at Kohl Farms. November 23, Collide will have a float in the Sebewaing Lighted Parade. Sunday, December 8 will be the annual roast beef dinner. July 2025 will be the next National Youth Gathering in New Orleans, a planning meeting will be September 29 for anyone interested. Mrs. Brink is starting a recycling program. She is accepting donations for get it up and running. CTK has some used Chromebooks for sale for \$40, money from these will go back into the technology fund.

Committee Reports: Sunday School kickoff was September 15! We had 10 middle schoolers, 4 2nd-5th graders and 4 preschool-1st graders.

Soccer has 14 players this year, trouble getting refs has caused an increase to \$150/game. Volleyball is being coached by Mrs. Sweetman and Mrs. Kemp. Cross Country is coached by Amanda Langmaid. The Next Athletic Director meeting is in October.

Thursday, September 19 at 3pm, Day3Seeds seed scooping event will be at Immanuel. OWLs are accepting donations for raffles and a light supper will be provided.

Pastor's Report: September 22 will be Seminary Sunday with a discussion held during bible study. Saturday, October 5 the Lutheran Thumb event will be held here at Immanuel. There is an opportunity to sing in the choir, lots of hymns and break-out sessions. Plan to attend!
