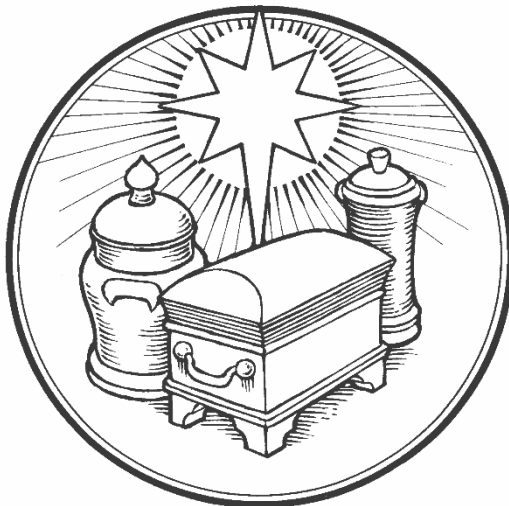

For this reason I, Paul, a prisoner for Christ
Jesus on behalf of you Gentiles—²assuming
that you have heard of the stewardship of God's
grace that was given to me for you, ³how the
mystery was made known to me by revelation,
as I have written briefly. ⁴When you read this,
you can perceive my insight into the mystery of
Christ, ⁵which was not made known to the sons
of men in other generations as it has now been
revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by
the Spirit. ⁶This mystery is that the Gentiles are
fellow heirs, members of the same body, and
partakers of the promise in Christ Jesus through
the gospel.

⁷Of this gospel I was made a minister
according to the gift of God's grace, which was
given me by the working of his power. ⁸To me,
though I am the very least of all the saints, this
grace was given, to preach to the Gentiles the
unsearchable riches of Christ, ⁹and to bring to
light for everyone what is the plan of the
mystery hidden for ages in God who created all
things, ¹⁰so that through the church the
manifold wisdom of God might now be made
known to the rulers and authorities in the
heavenly places. ¹¹This was according to the
eternal purpose that he has realized in Christ
Jesus our Lord, ¹²in whom we have boldness
and access with confidence through our faith in
him.

Matthew 2:1-12

Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of
Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold,
wise men from the east came to
Jerusalem, ²saying, "Where is he who has been
born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when
it rose and have come to worship him." ³When
Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and
all Jerusalem with him; ⁴and assembling all the
chief priests and scribes of the people, he
inquired of them where the Christ was to be
born. ⁵They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea,
for so it is written by the prophet:

⁶"And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of
Judah, are by no means least among the rulers
of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who
will shepherd my people Israel."

⁷Then Herod summoned the wise men
secretly and ascertained from them what time
the star had appeared. ⁸And he sent them to
Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for
the child, and when you have found him, bring
me word, that I too may come and worship
him." ⁹After listening to the king, they went on
their way. And behold, the star that they had
seen when it rose went before them until it
came to rest over the place where the child
was. ¹⁰When they saw the star, they rejoiced

exceedingly with great joy. ¹¹And going into the house they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh. ¹²And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed to their own country by another way.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son

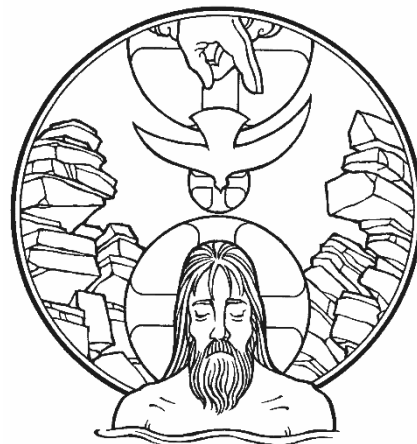

Talk About Next Sunday's Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 42.1-9

How is baptism our death?
 If we have died with Christ are we really raised with Him?

Catechism Selection (this may be read, recited, or spoken responsively)

Confession

What is Confession?

Confession has two parts. First, that we confess our sins, and second, that we receive absolution, that is, forgiveness, from the pastor as from God Himself, not doubting, but firmly believing that by it our sins are forgiven before God in heaven.

What sins should we confess?

Before God we should plead guilty of all sins, even those we are not aware of, as we do in the Lord's Prayer; but before the pastor we should confess only those sins which we know and feel in our hearts.

Which are these?

Consider your place in life according to the Ten Commandments: Are you a father, mother, son, daughter, husband, wife, or worker? Have you been disobedient, unfaithful, or lazy? Have you been hot-tempered, rude, or quarrelsome? Have you hurt someone by your words or deeds? Have you stolen, been negligent, wasted anything, or done any harm?
