Summer

Summer is here, finally! We have moved past the festival half of the church year. Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Holy Week, Easter, Ascension Day, and the Day of Pentecost are behind us. We move into the non-festival half of the church year. Through our summer months we focus on the teachings of Jesus instead of the life and acts of Jesus.

But there is a temptation in these summer months. That temptation is not to meet together. There are, after all, no big church festivals through our summer months to bring us together. No Christmas or Easter or Pentecost Day to bring our family together to celebrate what Christ has done for us. To come to church for Proper 10 might not seem the same as coming for Christmas Eve or Easter morning.

The temptation in the summer to not meet together is strong, isn't it? The weather might be too beautiful or maybe too hot for Sunday worship. Sports schedules may seem prohibitive to worship. Skipping a Sunday or two might seem just easy. And may those two Sundays roll into a few more. Let's be honest, this is easy to have happen to us.

But what is the solution? You already know. The early church knew how easy it was to fall away from the love of Christ. After all the amazing events of Jesus' life the early Christians made it a habit of meeting together. They wanted to...they needed to meet together. Luke writes in Acts chapter 2.42, "And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers."

They were *devoted* to the teaching of the apostles and the Lord's Supper. This became important in their lives. They wanted to be around the teachings of Jesus and receive His gifts. What sort of people were those Christians? They wanted to be faithful. Through their faithfulness many others saw and believed also. Isn't that the way it goes? Others come to faith by seeing the example of others?

Consider Saul (well, Paul). He was a young man and there to hear and witness the words and stoning of the faithful martyr Stephen. He had that conversion experience on the road to Damascus, but wasn't it the witness of Stephen that prepared Saul for that conversion? What if Stephen didn't make that confession of Jesus? What sort of person was Stephen?

So what sort of person will you be this summer? Will you be with us at Immanuel through the summer months? Will you hear the voice of Jesus teaching His church week after week? Will you be with us to study that Word of God? Will you be with the family of Christ for fellowship? Will you give such a faithful witness as Stephen? Who knows who you will impact with your faithfulness? Kids, grandkids, family may well see. But could Stephen have imagined that Saul would be so impacted by his witness?

So let us then be faithful this summer in receiving the gifts of Jesus. Let us rejoice together in all that Jesus has done for us. Let's spend time together in fellowship hearing from one another this summer. Growing in faith in God and all He has done for us and in love for one another.

Council Meeting May 11

Elders: Affirmations of Faith – Michael Herman and Rocky Hahn. Transfers Out – James Gunsell, Shannon, Jason and Estee Emery. Those asking to be removed – Nancy Eberlein, Brian and Parker Ritchey, Amanda Roggenbuck, Stephanie Long, Lauren Adam and Marc Geiger. 95 names remain in the inactive list and will be considered self-excluded. There is still one open seat on the Board of Elders.

Trustees: Bell Tower update – to get a better estimate there is an \$11,400 survey cost, which would be put toward the cost of the project if we proceed. We are also looking into another option. The heating project is expected to begin this summer. We are waiting on a quote for roof repairs. There is still one open seat on the Board of Trustees.

Stewardship: The cookbook is complete and headed to the printer soon! Proceeds from the cookbook sales will go toward church kitchen supplies.

Evangelism: The collection of items for the Good Samaritan Mission is over. A float is being planned for the SugarFest Parade – see Ken Walz to help/donate. We will be at Kohl Farms August 15 for their Country Music Fest to hand out information.

Youth: June 21 from 2-4pm we will be hosting an ice cream social at SugarFest. Confirmation Receptions will take place before service on May

3 and May 10. A Graduation Reception will take place before service on May 17.

School Board: The 2nd billboard is up, a 3rd is coming this summer. Friday is Music Festival at Valley Lutheran High School – we have 2 handbell choirs going and an individual performance.

Principal's Report: Our A & B track teams are doing well. Congratulations to our confirmands from St Paul and Immanuel. New cameras will be installed at the Unionville Campus. May field trips are coming up in May. School is closed May 22-26 for Memorial Day. June 2 at 7pm will be 8th grade graduation. June 3 will be our closing chapel.

Pastor's Report: Ascension Day service is Thursday, May 14 at 6:30pm. Call day services are April 28 & 29 and can be found on Facebook. There were 157 open calls and only 79 men graduating, leaving 78 positions unfulfilled. Pastor will be gone to conferences May 13-14, May 19-20 and July 18-23.

President: Discussion was had on Peter Boyer's letter requesting support for pre-seminary and seminary schooling. Council recommends we use the 2% that normally goes to Concordia Seminary and Concordia Theological Seminary and assign it directly to Peter Boyer's education account. This will be reviewed annually and renewed potentially for the 7 years of his seminary training.

Vice President: The 2026-2027 Budget of \$838,919 and the ballot is now complete to our abilities, leaving an open seat on in Elders. The Endowment Fund has approved a request for 12 radio broadcasts to be dedicated in honor of Immanuel members. It was discussed that we should be including year to date financials in the monthly newsletter in addition to the previous month. We will make this happen.

Stewardship: The cookbook is on its way to the printer soon! Watch for details on how to get your copy. Julie Burgess will be coming to discuss financial planning and giving in relation to estate planning on Sunday, June 7th during Bible Class. This free informational class has been made possible by the LCMS Foundation.

Trustees: We have two big projects upcoming; the heating system for the church and the bell tower. We are hoping to get two options for the bell tower for repair or removal so we can make informed decisions moving forward.

Elders: not present

School Board: CTK received a \$19,000 safety grant that will be used for security upgrades such as new cameras, swipe systems and an upgrade to lunch room window. CTK also received an anonymous grant for \$100,000 to be spend as follows: 75% on an immediate need and 25% on advertisement and student enrollment. Please watch for new billboards and informational handouts. The two handbell choirs that attended Music Fest at VLHS received I ratings! CTK track regionals were at VLHS this past weekend with a number of kids qualifying for states. CTK will be offering Developmental Kindergarten beginning this fall. The 2026-2027 school calendar has been set, with a start date of Tuesday, August 18.

Evangelism: We will have a float in the SugarFest parade. We will be at Kohl Farms Saturday, August 15 for

their Country Music Festival with an informational table.

Youth Board: Youth board hosted two Confirmation receptions and one Graduation reception in May. Sunday, June 21 at SugarFest we will be hosting our annual ice cream social from 2-4pm.

Principal: CTK hosted an Academic Fair in March. The students did a great job and many visitors walked through. Grades 7 & 8 had a great trip to Washington DC. The last few weeks of school are filled with field trips, end of year testing, and beginning prep for the next year. Mommy Muffin day was held last Friday in Unionville. Senior return day will be May 27. We had many students qualify for the state track meet that will be held at VLHS on May 30. We are excited to offer Developmental Kindergarten this fall! It is our hope that these students will stay at CTK instead of going to USA.

Athletics: All sports are wrapping up for the year. We will be meeting to set up next year's athletic schedules.

Sunday School: We average 2-3 students in Sunday School per week. Please be looking mid-July for a survey that will be asking what can be done to get more families/kids involved in Sunday School.

Endowment and Capital Fund: We have raised/grown the endowment fund to \$385,000. We have pamphlets available for more information on how this fund can be used. We will also be speaking at the Julie Burgess presentation. Please come to get more information.

Correspondence: Tom read a letter from Peter Boyer asking for prayers and financial support from ILC to attend Concordia Chicago pre-seminary and Concordia Theological Seminary in preparation for his vocation as a pastor. Council has been deliberating this request and is

making a recommendation that we use the 2% of budgeted income that would go to Concordia Seminary and Concordia Theological to support Peter. It would be reviewed annually and anticipated to be available over the next 7 years of his studies. A motion was made and passed.

Pastor: Thank you to the Trustees for the new garage doors on the parsonage. Installation of New Officers will be June 28. Pastor attended the Circuit Visitors Conference in Frankenmuth May 13 & 14. There he was gifted with a picture and letter dated January 13, 1877 of Pastor Walther, our first Synodical President. Pastor will be in Frankenmuth May 19 & 20 for the North and East Pastors Conference. Pastor and Peter will be traveling to Phoenix in July to attend the 69th LCMS synodical convention. Peter is the lay delegate for Thumb West. Pastor noted he gained a few fun facts at the conference. Pastors are becoming fewer in number and older. Churches are trending down to where more churches are represented with smaller numbers of members vs those churches with larger numbers of members.

President: The proposed budget passed with 41 yes votes and 9 no votes. All names listed (running unopposed) were voted in. Elders have 1 empty seat and Stewardship was filled with Ursula, Theresa, and Raylene.

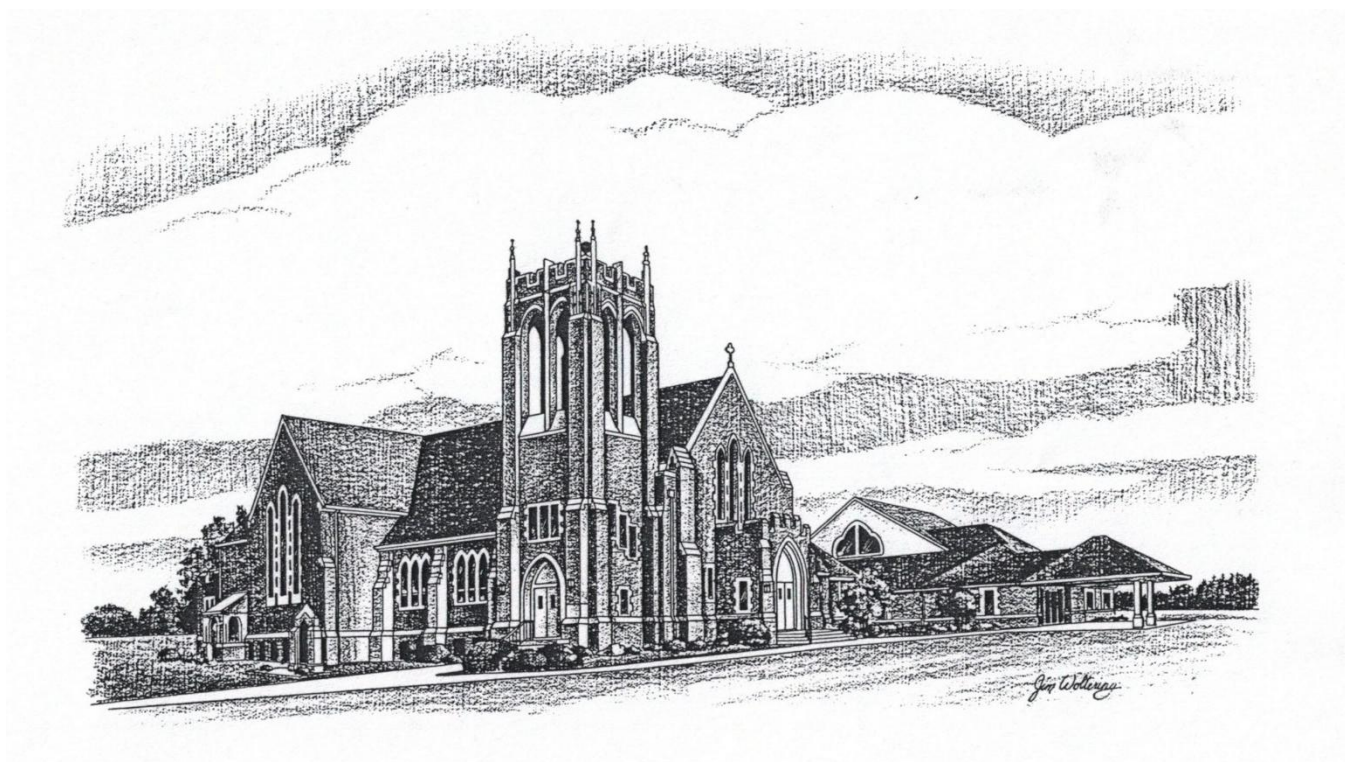
