Out Giving God

"One who is faithful in a very little is also faithful in much, and one who is dishonest in a very little is also dishonest in much." - Luke 16.10

There was no way he wasn't getting fired. He had been dishonest in managing the master's accounts. Everyone knew it too. They all knew the crimes and sins he had committed. What was worse, the master knew it. He was about to be fired.

But there was that short moment before the master actually fired him. He had a matter of perhaps minutes, so what could he do? Calling those who owed his master debts he had them reduce their debts. Those who had their debts reduced thought little of it. The master was a generous man and this was keeping with his character. He had reduced their debts before and no doubt would in the future. The master was the most generous man they knew! The dishonest manager knew the character of the master also. He was merciful and loving. He would allow the debts to be reduced.

They all knew the way this man operated. He gave and gave and gave. This was no way to run a business! But it was the way this master was. He was generous to a fault. The master commends the dishonest steward. He knew what he could get away with because of the compassion of the master! Jesus tells this parable not to recommend us to be dishonest, but to show us who we rely on.

Our master is compassionate and merciful to a fault. Out of love He sends His Son to this earth. Jesus takes on flesh to stand in our place under the law. He is betrayed and handed over to death. He is hung on the tree for us sinners. He drinks down the cup of wrath that should have been ours. He pays the full price for our sins on that tree. Is not our master compassionate and loving to a fault!

Beyond the second article blessings we have are all the first article blessings. Does not the master give you clothing and shoes, house, home, land, animals and all that you have? Does He not give you reason and senses to work for a living and benefit others? Does He not bless you with material abundance? Look around and see what how richly the master has blessed you.

All this He does only out of Fatherly divine goodness and mercy. There is no merit or worthiness in us. We are sinners and do not deserve the master's compassion. We deserve His wrath.

Jesus tells the parable of the dishonest manager to remind you how to react to your master. You know where to place your trust- in Jesus. You know what He has done for you. You see it as your sins are forgiven and you are redeemed before Him. So now what? How much more should you use all that you have to further His kingdom. How much more should you trust Him and give.

Is that what Jesus is saying? Is He talking about money! Yes, Jesus says, "You cannot serve both God and money (Luke 16.13b)." Where your treasure is there your heart will be also. Jesus reminds you that where you put your money is where your heat is. Of course you can react like the Pharisees and ridicule Jesus (Luke 16.14). What a fool Jesus is to demand your willing obedience. What a joke that He would ask you to trust Him to give back to Him. You need your money, every penny. And the man who built bigger barns, what was demanded of him (Luke12.16-21)? So it is with everyone who lays up treasure for himself and is not rich toward God.

Jesus invites you to be rich toward God. How can you out give God? Giving is a sign of faith and trust in your Lord and master. It is a trust that your master is compassionate and living. And a sign of healthy faith. Giving back to God our tithes is our reaction to having been saved. In this little moment of our lives how shall we react to the mercy of God? Does it mean anything to us that Jesus as died to save us from our sins? If it does we should, like Abel, joyfully give back to God.

But does Jesus even care what we give? He commended Abel and did not accept the offering of Cain. He does care. The dishonest manager knew the compassion of his master. How much more we who know all that God has

done for us! How much more should we rely on His mercy and step out and step up in faith by giving. God does not need your treasure, but you need to give that you would learn to rely and trust in Him above all things. That you would return and give thanks for all the blessings that He has given you. All that He has is yours. How can we not give back.

We don't have to do anything for Jesus' love. We don't have to be like the pharisees or scribes that think they are better than everyone else. They think Jesus is wrong for mingling with sinners, but it is they who are self-righteous and wrong.

Don't be self-righteous, be like Jesus. Share the love that Jesus shares with you, with your brothers and sisters in Christ, as well as, "those who trespass against you!"
