Councilman Waters gave an update on the meeting with the beautification committee. Following the update and discussion, a motion was made by Knipfer, seconded by Schimke for Councilman Natasha Waters to organize a networking meeting with organizations around the city. A discussion was held on security camera at the swimming pool. It was decided to get additional information for the next meeting.

Mayor Brian Bergeleen stated this was the time and place for the Public Hearing for the request of Additional SRF Funding for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Street Project and the College Avenue Project. No interest parties were in attendance.

An amendment to the design contract for the airport project from Helms and Associates in the amount of \$9,889.56 was presented to the Council. The cost will be grant eligible for 100%. A motion was made by Schooler, seconded by Fagerhaug to approve the amendment and authorize the Mayor to sign. Ayes: 6 Nays: 0 Motion carried.

A proposal from Mead & Hunt to due an independent fee evaluation for the airport in the amount of \$5,000 was presented to the Council. The cost will be grant eligible with the City share to be 5%. A motion was made by Schimke, seconded by Knipfer to approve the request, and authorize the mayor to sign the proposal. Ayes: 6 Nays: 0 Motion carried.

A motion was made by Schooler, seconded by Knipfer to enter into executive session pursuant to SDCL 1-25-2 (1) Personnel at 8:14 PM. Ayes: 6 Nays: 0 Motion carried.

Council reconvened into regular session at 9:10 PM.

A motion was made by Schooler, seconded by Schimke to do an independent audit of the utility accounts with Kari Fagerhaug and Tim Schooler to be on the committee. Ayes: 6 Nays: 0 Motion carried. A motion was made by Knipfer, seconded by Fagerhaug to adjourn the meeting. Ayes: 6 Nay: 0 motion carried.
