

LOGLINE

After withstanding hurricanes, floods and other storms for 123 years, this Forgotten Enchantress faces the storm of destruction for commercial gain. Will the small team of compassionate citizens save her in time?

SYNOPSIS

Forgotten Enchantress is the story of Green Gables, in the voice of the Queen Anne-style Victorian house, built in Melbourne, Florida, by William T. and Nora Wells, in the late 19th century. Set amid a period backdrop with a yearning hope for future generations, the film is narrated by the current and former president of the nonprofit organization created exclusively to save this treasured piece of Americana, as well as an 82-year-old storytelling businessman who states why he believes the house must be saved and restored. Forgotten Enchantress documents the contributions of the innovative family who built the house and their legacy.

OUR STORY

When the founders of bUneke Productions first learned about the work being done by the nonprofit organization, Green Gables at Historic Riverview Village, they immediately started formulating a plan to create a documentary to spotlight the charity's amazing journey to save this bit of American history.

Marion Ambrose President

Not long after assuming the position of president of Green Gables at Historic Riverview Village, with the blessing of the new board of directors, Marion began expanding the organization's public outreach. This led to a meeting with the founders of bUneke.org, which initiated a magnificent, community-wide collaboration.











John Daly Historian

Attorney and historic preservation advocate, John Daly is president emeritus of Green Gables at Historic Riverview Village. He discovered Green Gables, while researching for a survey about historical community resources, in 2008, four years after the building had received extensive damage from the 2004 hurricane season. He, and other members of the nonprofit worked to stop demolition of the house and he continues to work toward saving this once forgotten enchantress.

Susan Craft Family Member

A registered nurse, Susan Craft is the widow of one of the direct descendants of William and Nora Wells. She and her husband lived together in a home they built adjacent to the Green Gables house, when they married, 37 years ago. Although she is not, herself, a direct descendant, she understands the value in preserving this enchanting structure for future generations.

Charles W. Jackson, Sr. Business Owner

Charles W. Jackson, Sr. is the owner of his own roofing company and with his extensive knowledge of construction, is considered an expert. He has held a seat on the Brevard County Building and Zoning Commission for almost half of his 82 years. An animated storyteller, Mr. Jackson is a frequent visitor to the Green Gables' open houses.

DIRECTOR, Jennifer East

A passionate and driven creator, when Jennifer East met Marion Ambrose and Sue Fallon, she didn't hesitate to arrange to visit Green Gables. She was hooked after her first tour of the forgotten enchantress, Green Gables.

Mrs. East's passion for her work and the stories she tells is evident in every project she touches. She has been directing projects for others for many years and has fulfilled many roles in the industry.

Filming Forgotten Enchantress has been a true labor of love for her as she and her team of volunteers have created this documentary with a zero-dollar budget.

She said, "I knew I needed to do something to save this enchanting piece of American history. With an extremely tight deadline, we went to work."
