On September 23rd, we had the pleasure of welcoming Maryann, a representative from the National CARF (Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities) Organization to The Diamond Head Clubhouse. Her visit was part of an important evaluation to assess the efficiency and effectiveness of our program.

Maryann toured the entire Clubhouse and expressed genuine enjoyment throughout her visit. She was particularly impressed by our garden and the transition from ground gardening to raised-bed gardening. She met with Paul, Director of The Diamond Head Clubhouse, and asked questions about our program and operations. During the tour, a meeting was in session that included both staff and participants, so there wasn't much of an opportunity for member interactions with Maryann. This helped ensure a smooth visit, without the concerns over saying the "wrong" thing under pressure.

Before Maryann's visit, our team conducted an internal review to ensure all required standards and safety procedures were in place. We are especially grateful to Karen, who, even after retiring, returned to support us through this process. She worked closely with our new Quality Manager Nurse, together they gathered the essential information and visited sites to evaluate our strengths and identify areas for improvement.

One of CARF's core values is gathering feedback from program members. In advance, we collected member feedback through the satisfaction surveys, and this data got entered into our system for the CARF surveyor's review. This input is vital because our members are at the heart of everything we do.

We are happy to report that Maryann left our Clubhouse smiling—a sign that she genuinely enjoyed her time with us. We are currently awaiting the results of our accreditation, as the clinics and clubhouses statewide are participating in this process. We remain optimistic and will learn more about our accreditation status in due course.

Thank you to all staff and participants for your hard work, dedication, and professionalism during the CARF visit. Your efforts made a real difference.



The lotus bloom, a treasure rare, A symbol of hope, beyond compare. It shows us that we can rise above, And bloom with beauty, in endless love.






Battle of the Champions: Corn Hole Saga
