We harvested about 3 pounds of sweet potatoes. Paul used some to make a sweet potato salad that was oh so delicious. He mixed in some beets, feta cheese, and lettuce. Since we grew it and harvested ourselves it tasted that much better. That was very satisfying. There was also some turmeric that needed to be harvested. We harvested around 5 pounds from only 3 plants! Turmeric is a plant with many health benefits and is a relative to the ginger plant. Some of turmeric's health benefits is, it's an anti-inflammatory, it aids in digestion, improves liver function, and is a natural pain killer, among many other benefits. Staff member Mark, has a family member that processes turmeric into a balm for minor aches and pain, so that's what we will be doing with most of it, and of course we will also be eating it! The orange tree has been very generous this year with her fruit as well. It is hard to keep up with the amount of fruit she is producing, but we are trying our best to not let any go to waste.
